### **INVITATION TO JOIN A NEW INSURANCE COMMITTEE**

A new Insurance Committee is being established to review and collate data from various Committees to use for development of a comprehensive inventory of all District assets and each piece of tangible property, approximate useful life expectancy, current and projected replacement costs, and anticipated and needed repair costs to meet standards or address damages. As the Chairperson of this new Committee, I invite you to submit your name and credentials to me for consideration. The Committee will also review our existing Insurance policies, meet with representatives from P&C carriers, and make recommendations for future coverage that will best meet the needs of the District.

The data we will be gathering will also be used by the Planning Committee to formulate short and long range plans for the repair or replacement of existing assets and the acquisition of new assets. Likewise, the data will be used to assist the Budget and Finance Committee to identify what assets need to be replace, retired, or updated in the upcoming budget year and how much money needs to be set aside for repairs/replacement and how much needs to be put into reserves for future needs.

Ideally, I am looking for volunteers who are familiar with P&C insurance for commercial properties and who may have worked in the insurance industry. I am also seeking individuals with current or past experience in writing business plans, conducting capital needs analyses, or other financial planning.

Judy presented the box of assorted cards to Marlene Durgin, the 2023 Sunshine Committee.




