Our Bay won't be saved until the Manatee sings. She won't sing until your voice is heard at the County Commission hearing.

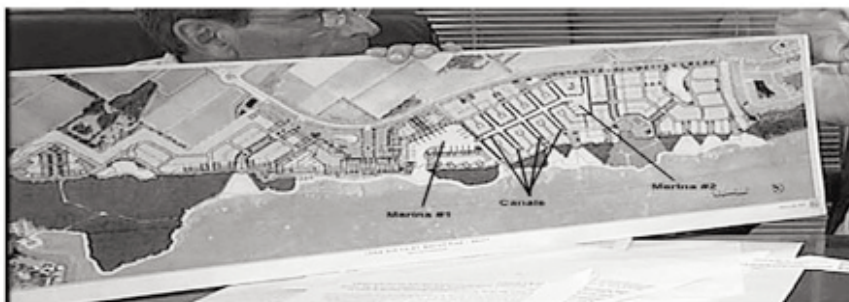
On January 23rd, 2014, 9am, at the Bradenton Area Convention Center, the Manatee Board of County Commissioners will conduct a public hearing to consider final approval of a Future Land Use Map change to re-designate the 462-acre Long Bar Pointe at 75th Street and El Conquistador Boulevard from Res-9 to MU. MU allows a mix of uses including intense, regional-serving commercial, hotel and conference center. It also includes water-dependent amenities such as seawalls, marinas, casinos, and light-industrial boat yards.

The Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council has called the property and its grassflats a "regionally significant natural resource." The people of Cortez call this fertile fish nursery "The Kitchen."

Don't be misled by reports saying "We won."

Although the citizens of Manatee won a major victory in preventing Long Bar Pointe LLP/Cargor Partners, VII from including a marina on their application, the intensity of land uses allowed in the MU land use will damage Sarasota Bay and undermine its critical role as a fish nursery, habitat for birds, and absorber of storm surges and flooding.

The intensity may be the right stuff, but it's in the wrong place. It would be better placed in a centralized downtown environment in with good accessibility and transit routes that don't cut through residential neighborhoods between the Sarasota-Bradenton Airport and Long Bar.

A quorum was established.

Present: Rose Woodruff, Suzanna Young, Jane King, Frank Young, Marie Young and Kathy Lokos.

Alan thanked Treasurer Jerry Gordon and 1st Vice Chairman Dan Rawlinson for their years of service and positive contribution to the Board.

Maynard made a motion to approve the November Minutes, Jeannette seconded. **Motion Passed.**

Jerry made a motion to approve November Financial Statements. Maynard seconded. **Motion Passed.**

MARINA: Maynard Boyce
Maynard stated the only thing left to finish at this point in the Marina is the wheel stops. Maynard recommended the stops be placed 6 feet from the edge of the seawall. Maynard reported Randy and Rick are working on a guide rail system to raise and lower the green range light. As it is now we have to have a bucket truck or lift to change the light. There is money left over from the fishing cleaning repair that can be used for this project.

HOUSE & GROUNDS: Bob King
Bob stated we have four bids to re-marcite the pool. Sparkling Kleen Pools will upgrade the plaster for \$6,000.00 more. This will give a 30 year warranty. Bob made a motion not to exceed \$60,000.00 to accept the bid from Sparkling Kleen Pools. Maynard seconded. **Motion passed.** Alan brought forward the point that with new code requirements the cost may exceed the \$60,000.00 Alan recommended adding an additional \$10,000.00. Bob amended his motion not to exceed \$70,000.00. Maynard seconded. **Motion passed.**

Our next scheduled meeting will be Saturday, January 11, 2014 at 10:00 AM. We will see you there.

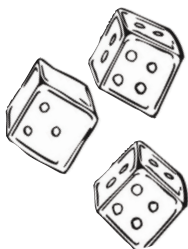

DOCKMASTER'S REPORT

As I write this with Christmas and New Years looming near, I am forced to look back over the passing of yet another year. There is much to remember and even more, most importantly, not to forget, all the goals that were met and the new ones that we've set. All the construction that was done and still the dust is not yet settled. The hop scotching of boats from one slip to another was a challenge. The loss of electric and water, and the threat of storms that thankfully never came were all just nuisances now that it is over. I've had to say farewell to many in the marina. Some of them had been with us for quite a long time. On the other hand we have many new folks to get to know and welcome into our midst. All and all 2013 was most assuredly a good year for the marina. A haul out is very likely in January with several boats returning to the water. If you are interested in hauling your boat out when these go back in, give me a call so I can get you in touch with the group. Since this article will hit the streets on or about the first of the year I should probably take a look forward at what's coming up for this year. Unfortunately, I'm not very good at prognosticating. I haven't picked the right six numbers in 15 years of trying. This could be the year. Maybe I will take a crack at the year to come next month. I wish a Happy, Healthy, and Prosperous New Year for each and every one of us.

Reminder- Vehicles inside gated areas of the Marina require a Bayshore Gardens numbered decal. Vehicles with trailers attached and no stickers are at risk of having both towed. No trailers without tow vehicles permitted. If you

have a special circumstance requiring an exception to these conditions let myself or the office know about it.

Improvements – The range light is slated to be reestablished with the new installation allowing for the replacing of the lamp without the use of a cherry picker. Also the new control unit is the same type used by Trailer Estates for their half of the range system. The parking bumpers will need to be reinstalled on the south side of the Marina once we figure out the best configuration. Next up should be the evaluation of the marina basin for dredging.

Repairs and Projects Completed – The stabilization of the piers in the Marina are complete. The fish dock and cleaning station have been stabilized. The paving repair to the south wall parking area is complete. Several broken water lines and electric lines were repaired over the course of the parking lot paving project.

Grown Up Grilled Cheese

1 cup vertically sliced red onion
1 large garlic clove, minced
1 cup shredded sharp white cheddar cheese
8 (1 1/2oz) slices hearty white bread
2 cups fresh spinach leaves
8 (1/4-inch-thick) slices tomato
6 slices center-cut bacon, cooked
Heat a large nonstick skillet over medium-low heat. Coat pan with cooking spray. Add 1 cup onion and garlic; cook for 10 minutes or until tender and golden brown, stirring occasionally. Sprinkle 2 tbsp cheese over each of 4 bread slices. Top each slice with 1/2 cup spinach, 2 tomato slices, 2 tbsp onion mixture, and 1 1/2 bacon slices. Sprinkle each with 2 tbsp cheese; top with the remaining 4 bread slices. Heat skillet over medium heat. Coat pan with cooking spray. Place sandwiches in pan, and cook for 3 minutes on each side or until golden brown and cheese melts.

Pork Chops with Homemade Applesauce

Applesauce:

1 tablespoon butter 1/2 cup water
3 apples, peeled, cored, and coarsely chopped (about 4 cups chopped)
2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice

Pork:

1/2 cup all-purpose flour
4 (5oz) bone-in center-cut pork chops
1/2 teaspoon salt 2 tbsp canola oil

To prepare applesauce, melt butter in a medium saucepan over medium heat. Add apples to pan; cook 4 minutes, stirring frequently. Add 1/2 cup water, sugar, juice, and 1/8 teaspoon salt to pan; cook 25 minutes, stirring occasionally. Cover and cook 25 minutes or until apples are tender. Mash gently with the back of a spoon. To prepare pork, heat a large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat. Place flour in a shallow dish. Sprinkle pork evenly with 1/2 teaspoon salt and pepper; dredge pork in flour. Add oil to pan; swirl to coat. Add pork to pan; cook 5 minutes or until golden. Turn pork over; cook 3 minutes or until desired degree of doneness. Serve with applesauce.

Warm Pasta Salad with Shrimp

3 cups uncooked farfalle (bow tie pasta)

1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
12 ounces medium shrimp, peeled & deveined

Cook pasta according to package directions, omitting salt and fat; drain.
Combine juice, mustard, and garlic in a small bowl, stirring well with a whisk. Gradually add oil, stirring constantly with a whisk. Stir in salt and pepper. Heat a large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat. Coat pan with cooking spray. Add shrimp to pan; cook for 2 minutes or until done. Stir in spinach, cannellini beans, red onion, and 2 tablespoons capers; toss to combine. Add the pasta and juice mixture to shrimp mixture; toss. *Price: \$2.07 per serving*

Sausage Ragù over Creamy Polenta

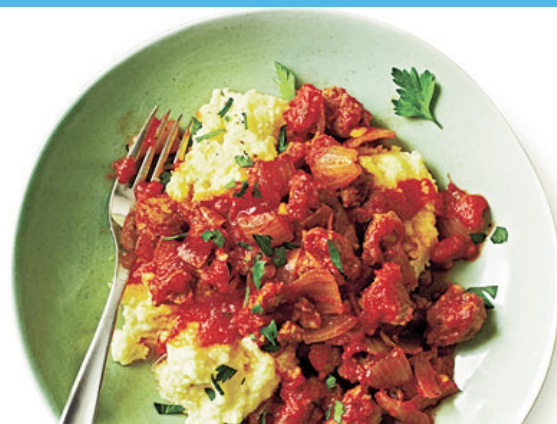
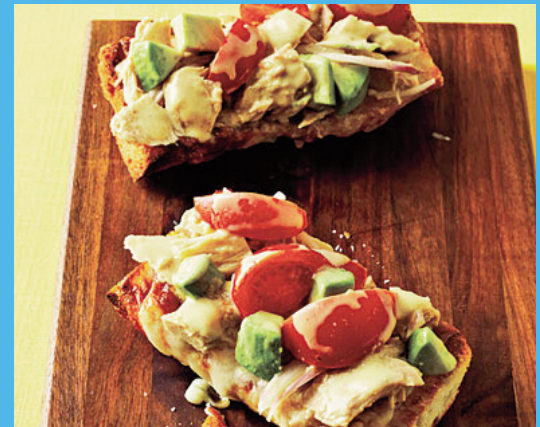
3 (4oz) links sweet turkey Italian sausage, casings removed
1 tbsp olive oil 1 cup whole milk
1 cup finely chopped onion
4 minced garlic cloves 3/4 cup instant polenta
1 1/2 cups lower-sodium marinara sauce
2 1/3 cups water, divided
1oz fresh pecorino Romano cheese, grated
1/8 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
1/4 cup coarsely chopped flat-leaf parsley
Heat a large skillet over medium-high heat. Add sausage; sauté for 6 minutes, stirring to crumble. Remove sausage from pan; drain. Wipe pan clean; return to medium-high heat. Add oil to pan; swirl. Add onion, and sauté 4 minutes. Add garlic; sauté 1 minute. Stir in sausage, marinara, and 1/3 cup water; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer 20 minutes. Bring remaining 2 cups water and milk to a boil in a medium saucepan over medium heat; reduce heat to low. Gradually add polenta, and cook for 3 minutes or until thick, stirring constantly. Tuna Melts with Avocado

2 1/2 tablespoons olive oil
2 tbsp thinly sliced shallots
1 tbsp Dijon mustard

1 1/2 tbsp fresh lemon juice
1 avocado
1 cup cherry tomatoes, quartered
1/3 cup shredded Swiss cheese
2 (6oz) pieces French bread, halved lengthwise and toasted
Preheat broiler to high.
Combine first 6 ingredients in a medium bowl, stirring well to coat. Place juice in a small bowl. Peel, seed, and chop avocado. Add avocado to juice; toss. Add avocado mixture and tomatoes to tuna mixture; toss well to combine. Sprinkle cheese evenly over cut sides of bread, and broil for 3 minutes or until cheese is bubbly. Place 1 bread slice, cheese side up, on each of 4 plates, and divide tuna mixture evenly among bread slices. *Price: \$2.41 per serving*

Quick Meatloaf

1/3 cup chopped green onions
3 tbsp dry breadcrumbs

1/8 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon dry mustard

1 pound ground sirloin
1 large egg, lightly beaten
6 tablespoons ketchup, divided
Cooking Spray
Preheat oven to 400°.
Combine first 9 ingredients in a large bowl; add 1/4 cup ketchup. Mix beef mixture with hands just until combined. Shape beef mixture into a 9 x 4-inch loaf on a broiler pan coated with cooking spray. Bake at 400° for 20 minutes. Brush top of meat loaf with remaining 2 tablespoons ketchup. 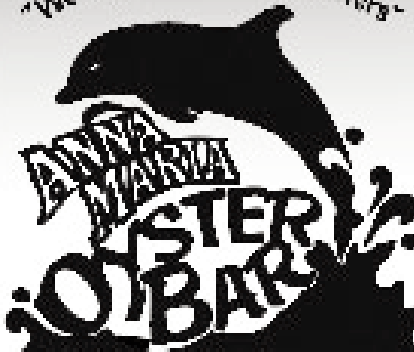

The Tournament of Roses Parade is held every year on New Year’s Day, unless it lands on a Sunday, then it is held on Monday, January 2nd. Why? Besides some local entries, all of the entrants in the competitions would decorate their carriages with flowers too. And so this is how the first Tournament of Roses parade was started.
