FYI FROM THE BOARD

At the January 26 Board of Trustees meeting the Board was advised that the pool has been patched so many times to try to patch it again would be counter-productive. District Office Manager, Gia Cruz, and House & Grounds Committee Chair, Kyle Weatherly, are in contact with more than a dozen pool contractors. So far, only one has responded with a bid of over \$300,000. Yes, it's a lot of money. But the company could begin work in six to eight weeks, the process would take about three months and the pool could be ready to open for July 4th.

Because of the expense the Board will be investigating other companies to insure we're going in the right direction.

The Board has been advised there is enough money, at the moment, to pay for the repairs.

Remember – The pool is original to the Community, making it more than 50 years old. During this fiscal year \$14,200 has been spent to keep the pool running, and there are more repairs being made to make sure the pool can be opened when the weather gets warmer. Our pool repair people tell us it may be only a matter of time before the pool has to be replaced at a cost of \$200,000 to \$400,000 in today's dollars.

Preliminaries - Roll call was taken, and a quorum was established. The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted. Meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. by Chairman Morris Raymer.

Trustees Attending - Morris Raymer, Steve Watkins, Barbara Greenberg, Melanie Woodruff, Terry Zimmerly, Barbara Susdorf, Belle Baxter, Kyle Weatherly, and Dan Rawlinson. B. Baxter excused herself from the meeting at 7:32 pm.

Also Attending - Gia Cruz, District Office Manager.

Approval of Minutes - M. Raymer called for the approval of the minutes for the Board of Trustees Work Session from November 10, 2021. M. Woodruff made a **motion to approve the minutes and cited that the recording for this meeting had ended just prior to the meeting conclusion. T. Zimmerly Seconded. Motion Passed, Unanimously.** M. Woodruff made a **motion to accept the minutes for 11/17/2021 Board of Trustees Meeting. B. Baxter Seconded. Motion Passed, Unanimously.**

Treasurer's Report - T. Zimmerly presented the monthly reports. S. Watkins made a **motion to accept the Treasurer's Report. D. Rawlinson Seconded.** Discussion ensued. B. Greenberg inquired about TBD items in the report. T. Zimmerly advised that we are waiting on the auditor's report to make the final determination on funds available. **Motion Passed 8 to 1. B. Greenberg voted no.**

Committee Reports

Banner & Web Committee - B. Baxter suggested that the residents be made aware of the issues with the pool via the Banner or some other means.

Recreation Committee - B. Baxter gave Gia the

suggestions for the Recreation Committee schedule of meetings. Goal for 2022, complete first aid equipment, obtain the softball and T-ball equipment when the ball field is ready. The acquiring possibly of an inflatable slide for the pool.

Morris Raymer welcomed Simone Peters from Manatee County to the Meeting.

Long Range Planning Committee - T. Zimmerly stated that there was nothing new to bring before the Board. Sharon Densen advised that a qualified elector for a referendum is a Registered voter in the district.

Marina Committee - M. Ramer advised that he and Duncan Seawall are trying to coordinate with FP&L to complete the electrical in the marina. A possible single stall, unisex, bathroom facility with FOB controlled access is being discussed for marina. He is seeking approval to have plans made up. This was deferred until we hear back from a query made to Manatee County reference what if anything they would do. The non-refundable deposit for residents was discussed and it was noted that this has gone to the Policy and Procedures Committee for development. Motion detector lights may be a possible deterrent to theft in the marina. This will be discussed in committee. S. Watkins contends that the signs are illegal and a disservice to residents. Discussion ensued. No resolution was reached. The previously towed vehicle was in violation of contract and the Board has previously determined that the charges would not be reimbursed. The attorney will be consulted about the signs, and this will be addressed in committee.

House and Grounds Committee - K. Weatherly reported that the walking trail is being discussed in committee as well as parking lot signs. The basketball court and adjacent area are still being worked in committee. The pool issues are being addressed as noted earlier in the meeting. The same for the wide area WIFI.

MANATEE MATTERS WITH COMMISSIONER MISTY SERVIA

Thinking of running for local office?

Here are some things I've learned:

A recent invitation to participate in a panel discussion hosted by the League of Women Voters on "How to run for office" had me reflecting on my experience as a candidate and elected official. I am beginning the last year of my first term and am a candidate for re-election. It's my love for our community and public service that inspired me to run for office.

Local politics is a very meaningful place to serve if you want to see the fruits of your labor. Our work is made up of providing things that directly affect your quality of life: parks, roads, sidewalks and trails, schools, water, and managing the growth that is hitting us hard.

A typical day is listening to constituents who have quality of life problems: vehicles speeding through their neighborhood, or noise from a nearby business. I hear from people who want roads connected - and road connections removed. And we work on large-scale problems too, like improving foster care, promoting affordable housing, and helping the homeless. - but these have no simple fix. And there are a lot of differing opinions on how they should be tackled.

Today, we live in a world where national politics has crept into local politics, which I believe is distracting. The ideological divide that dominates news at the national level has little to do with our jobs in local government. One thing I can say for sure, is that your local government has no control over how the US deals with Ukraine or China. Nor does it have a final word on abortion, gun control, or vaccine mandates.

Another thing to consider is, when elected, you serve ALL of the people. That includes all political

parties, your opponent, and those who publicly criticize you. The job requires you to leave your personal feelings at the door and govern for everyone in the community.

My best advice if you're thinking of running for office:

1. Have a strong "why" before you decide to run. Do you want to help your community? Solve a major problem? Please don't run if you are looking to "be someone important". Run because you want to do something important.
2. Be Authentic! Know who you are and what your role is; and realize that you will have people who disagree with you - and that is okay.
3. Be ready to work hard and give 100%, and be focused on always improving efficiencies. We have to be very mindful of leveraging our tax dollars to squeeze every penny. The money that we are in charge of belongs to the community, and there is never enough.
4. Have a thirst for learning and be open to change. You will constantly be learning as a public official. And remember, the only thing that is constant is change.
5. Be able to think beyond your own perspective and work to understand other points of view. Social cognition or emotional intelligence allows us to infer information that is not directly observed, and understand people. This is a very important skill.

Finally, Everyone will have your cell phone number, email, and even know where you live; and they will call on you at all times - on all days - and ask for help. Are you good with that? I love solving these daily problems, and if you do too, then consider public service as an elected official. We need you!
