Roll Call: Steve Watkins, Dan Rawlinson, Debbie Korell, Maynard Boyce, Richard Nelson, Terry Zimmerly and James Couey.

A quorum was established.

Present: Allan Riga, Barbara Greenberg, Sharon Denson, Suzanna Young, Don Gassie, and Laine Boyce. Steve made a motion to approve the October financials, Jim seconded. **MOTION PASSED.** The November financials are still being discussed.

BGNA: Dan Rawlinson

Dan reported that the breakfast with Santa went well but there were only five children in attendance. It was well planned but next year there are thoughts of conducting a regular Christmas party. All the gifts that were left over from the event were later donated to Bayshore Elementary to kids that didn't receive any. Jodie Lawman starts on the 26th of December as our new Interim Office Manager.

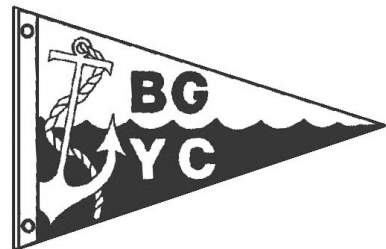

Restore Bayshore Reports Town Hall January 17 at Rec Center!

Monday, Dec. 11 at 6:35, meeting called to order.

Minutes which are in the Banner were accepted with corrections by Ogden Clark that: That the big developments out west will not be siphoning funds away from other southwest neighborhoods who need improvements or updates.

Our treasury is rather slim slim with an amount of \$2.64 after paying off back bills per Gwen Norris, Treasurer.

Ogden was given the floor to report on latest County actions that affected Bayshore Gardens. The sidewalk on Florida was again postponed because of changing plans at the County. The sidewalk may now be only 5 feet wide.

*(see below) As reported last month, sidewalks on Columbia and elsewhere will be going in early 2018.

Ogden will assess the surveys to see where con-

centration of approvals are concentrated and talk to Public Works about installing experimental speed tables in those areas to see if they work. We would like to see a couple to see how effective they are.

Samoset community, for instance, won 67% support from their community to get street lights put in. We will need to renew our efforts to keep the numbers going up on getting similar count on speed tables.

Town Hall will be held at 7:00 pm. Plans were made: Gwen Norris and Sharon Denson will be signing people in at the meeting; Jeanne Corbin will be handling the index cards for questions and comments. Suzanna and Holly Clause will be moderators. We welcome people to be hosts. We still need someone to be timer.

Bayshore Gardens residents are asked to bring their comments and questions to the Town Hall meeting.

A notice will appear in the Herald as this is a meeting with our "District 4" Commissioner, Robin DiSabatino. We are anticipating a good turn out from the community.

At the January 8 meeting, we will be making signs for our own community. Suzanna and Gwen will bring materials and the printed messages to put together.

Meeting adjourned 7:40 pm. Next scheduled meeting will be January 8th.

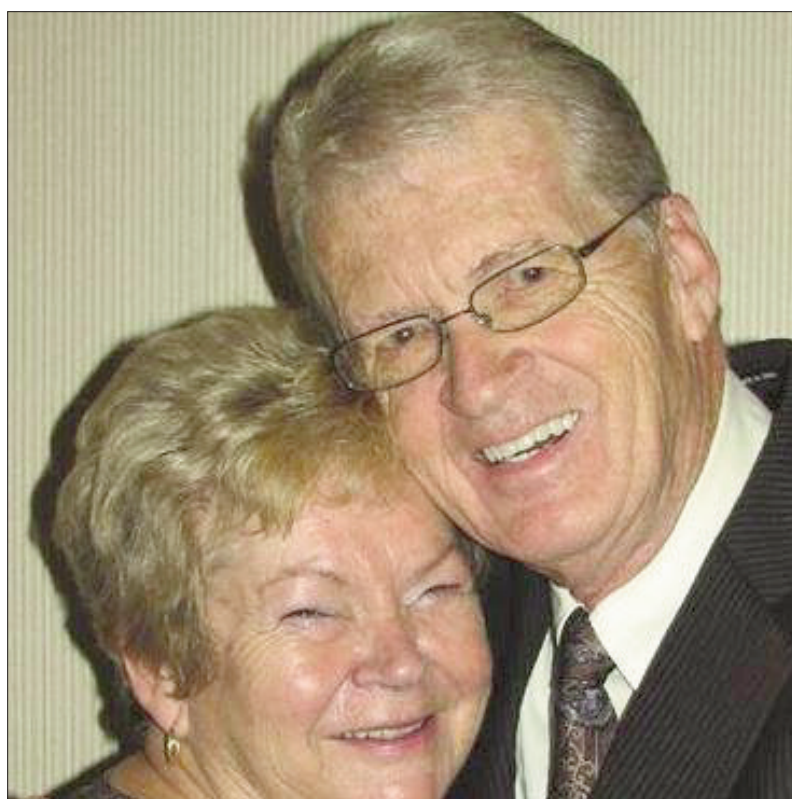

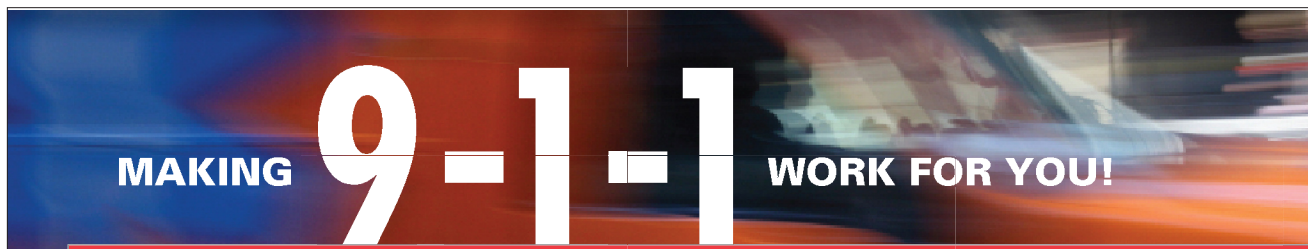
BGYC Christmas Party

Potluck Recipes

Buffalo Wing Dip Recipe

2 pkgs (8 oz each) cream cheese, softened
 1/2 cup ranch salad dressing
 1/2 cup sour cream
 5 tbsp crumbled blue cheese
 2 cups shredded cooked chicken
 1/2 cup Buffalo wing sauce
 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese, divided
 1 green onion, sliced

In a small bowl, combine the cream cheese, dressing, sour cream and blue cheese. Transfer to a 3-qt. slow cooker. Layer with chicken, wing sauce and 1 cup cheese. Cover and cook on low for 2-3 hours or until heated through. Sprinkle with remaining cheese and onion. Serve with tortilla chips. Yield: 6 cups.

Cheeseburger Mini Muffins

1/2 pound ground beef
 1 small onion, finely chopped
 2-1/2 cups all-purpose flour
 1 tbsp sugar; 2 tsp baking powder
 1 tsp salt; 3/4 cup ketchup
 3/4 cup whole milk
 1/2 cup butter, melted

2 large eggs; 1 tsp prepared mustard
 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
 In a large skillet, cook beef and onion over medium heat until meat is no longer pink; drain. In a small bowl, combine the flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. In another bowl, combine the ketchup, milk, butter, eggs and mustard; stir into the dry ingredients just until moistened. Fold in the beef mixture and cheese. Fill greased miniature muffin cups three-fourths full. Bake at 425° for 15-18 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean. Cool for 5 minutes before removing from pans to wire racks. Serve warm. Refrigerate leftovers. Yield: 5 dozen.

Editor's Note: Muffins may be baked in regular-size muffin cups for 20-25 minutes; recipe makes 2 dozen. Tips: Mix gently to avoid dense muffins. These also are great with ground pork or turkey. For the most flavor, we recommend using sharp cheddar.

Sausage Mushroom Appetizers Recipe

48 large fresh mushrooms
 2 large eggs, lightly beaten
 1 pound Jones No Sugar Pork Sausage Roll, cooked and crumbled
 1 cup shredded Swiss cheese
 1/4 cup mayonnaise; 3 tbsp butter, melted
 2 tbsp finely chopped onion
 2 tsp spicy brown or horseradish mustard
 1 tsp garlic salt; 1 tsp Cajun seasoning
 1 tsp Worcestershire sauce

Remove mushroom stems; set caps aside. In a large bowl, combine remaining ingredients. Stuff into mushroom caps. Place in two greased 13x9 baking dishes. Bake, uncovered, at 350° for 16-20 minutes. Yield: 4 dozen. Editor's Note: Low-fat or fat-free mayonnaise is not recommended.

Chickaritos

3 cups finely chopped cooked chicken
 1-1/2 cups shredded sharp cheddar cheese
 1 can (4 ounces) chopped green chilies
 4 green onions, finely chopped
 1 tsp hot pepper sauce
 1 tsp garlic salt
 1/4 tsp paprika
 1/4 tsp ground cumin
 1/4 tsp pepper

2 17.3 oz ea frozen puff pastry, thawed
 1 large egg, beaten
 Salsa and guacamole
 Preheat oven to 425°. In a large bowl, combine chicken, cheese, chilies, onions, pepper sauce and seasonings. Unfold one sheet of puff pastry onto a lightly floured surface. Roll into a 12x9-in. rectangle. Cut into nine rectangles. Place 2 tbsp filling across center of each rectangle. Brush edges of pastry with water and roll pastry around filling. Press edges with a fork to seal. Repeat with remaining pastry and filling. Refrigerate, covered, until ready to bake. Place pastries on a lightly greased baking sheet, seam side down. Brush tops with egg. Bake 20-25 minutes or until golden brown. Serve warm with salsa and guacamole. Yield: 3 dozen

Sesame Omelet Spinach Spirals

4 tbsp tahini
 4 spinach tortillas (8 inches), warmed
 6 eggs
 2 tbsp each finely chopped green onion, sweet red pepper, canned water chestnuts
 2 tbsp shredded carrot
 1 tsp minced fresh gingerroot
 1/4 tsp crushed red pepper flakes
 2 tsp sesame oil, divided

DIPPING SAUCE:

1/4 cup reduced-sodium soy sauce
 1 tbsp minced fresh cilantro
 1 garlic clove, minced
 1 tsp sesame seeds, toasted
 1 tsp rice vinegar; 1 tsp sesame oil
 1/4 tsp grated orange peel

Spread tahini over tortillas; set aside. In a small bowl, whisk the eggs, onion, red pepper, water chestnuts, carrot, ginger and pepper flakes. Heat a large nonstick skillet over medium heat; lightly brush with some of the oil. Pour 1/3 cup egg mixture into the pan; cook for 1 minute over or until set. Flip egg mixture and cook 30 seconds to 1 minute longer or until lightly browned. Place omelet on a tortilla; roll up. Repeat three times, brushing skillet as needed with remaining oil. Cut wraps into 1-in. slices. Combine the sauce ingredients; serve with spirals. Yield: 2-1/2 dozen (1/3 cup sauce).

Cucumber-Stuffed Cherry Tomatoes


24 cherry tomatoes
 1 package (3 oz) cream cheese, softened
 2 tbsp mayonnaise
 1/4 cup finely chopped peeled cucumber
 1 tbsp finely chopped green onion
 2 tsp minced fresh dill

Cut a thin slice off the top of each tomato. Scoop out and discard pulp; invert tomatoes onto paper towels to drain. In a small bowl, combine cream cheese and mayonnaise until smooth; stir in the cucumber, onion and dill. Spoon into tomatoes. Refrigerate until serving. Yield: 2 dozen.
