

#### Minutes for November 7, 2022

Meeting was called to order by Gwen Norris, President, at 1:00. We had a pledge allegiance to the flag. 15 attended the meeting and presentation.

**Secretary's Report** – The minutes were in the October Banner. There was no discussion. Joyce Fisher moved to accept the report. Winnie Denny-Smith seconded the motion.

Treasurer's Report – Marie Young gave the report and said that there are currently 17 members. Joyce Fisher moved to accept the report. Melanie Woodruff seconded the motion. Marie Young motioned to donate \$50 to the Humane Society. Marlene Durgin seconded the motion, and the donation was given to Joyce Fisher to submit to The Humane Society for the club.

**Nominating committee** – A committee was formed to establish a list for next year's Officers. Joyce Fisher, Marlene Durgin, and Marie Young were selected and will meet at our December Luncheon to discuss nominees.

Gwen thanked Matilda Renovalez for calling/reminding the members of this meeting.

**Refreshments** –Gwen brought refreshments that were enjoyed after the presentation.

#### **New Business:**

**Presentation** - Mike Sircy, Master Gardener volunteer gave a presentation on Coyotes.

Do coyote mate with dogs. No. Coyotes (Canis Latrans) are all over Florida. They relocate due to habitat loss. Coyotes can swim to islands. They are less than 40 pounds, roam in about a 15-mile radius, can have six pups a year and both parents care for the young.

Can you shoot them? It is illegal to discharge firearms in subdivisions. If poison is used, other

animals could be killed. Coyotes eat anything - opossum, coons, cats, rats, birs. They are territorial and will attack domestic animals, cattle. From 1970 – 2020 there have been nine coyote attacks on humans with no fatality. But in five years there had been 21 fatalities by dog bites (between 2013-2018).

Coyotes are here to stay. If some are removed or killed there will be others to replace them. They are adaptable and intelligent.

Don't feed the coyotes. It's illegal. Remove pet food and contain all trash and compost. Protect pets especially in evening, early morning and at night. They can jump a six-foot fence. They breed in the winter and the partners stay together. If you encounter a coyote, wave your arms, pick up your small pet, make sounds (hazing and audible alarms seem to work).

Bayshore Gardens is on its way to having a viable CERT organization, but we need you. We have two new CERT members and two more to receive their certification in January. We currently are a part of Trailer Estates CERT, and are recognized by Manatee County to continue until we have enough members here in Bayshore Gardens. We will need some of our CERT members to be HAM operators as that is our communication in a disaster should we lose cell or 911 system. CERT will offer classes for Ham licensing test preparation in February. In an emergency CERT may authorize a licensed HAM radio operator to broadcast with a CERT member present. If you are interested, let us know and we will get you in the February class even if you are not a CERT member. If you have a HAM license CERT would like to have you join.

FEMA requires that all CERT members be certified to respond to a disaster. At the completion of your CERT Basic Training class you are issued a CERT badge that identifies you to other First Responders. In addition you will receive a CERT backpack and other safety equipment. CERT Basic Training classes will to be held in Trailer Estates and the schedule is January 2023 with four classes during the week in the evening and two Saturday classes. The times for weekday classes are from 6:00 to 9:30 PM and Saturday from 9:30 AM to midafternoon, the dates are 1/18, 1/19, 1/21,1/25, 1/26, and 1/28 of 2023. Email your interest to originaltr@cs.com to receive an application via email. CERT is a part of FEMA/Homeland Security. If you wish more information about CERT, google FEMA/CERT. The classes are free and once completed, your certification/identification is accepted nationwide.

As we grow, more benefits will be available to Bayshore Gardens residents, such as a Stop the Bleed Class, Active Shooter, Search and Rescue and more.

### How can you cope with market volatility?

These are unsettling times for investors. Even before the geopolitical crisis involving Russia and Ukraine, the financial markets were facing headwinds due to higher inflation, the anticipation of rising interest rates and the continuing effects of the pandemic. As an individual investor, should you take some type of action?

It's helpful to put today's headlines in perspective. Russia is one of the world's largest oil producers, so a conflict that could affect oil prices can have a ripple effect on many market sectors. Until the state of affairs in Ukraine calms down, market volatility may continue.

Even in this context of uncertainty, though, investors shouldn't lose sight of other factors that can affect the investment climate. The U.S. economy has been growing at a fast clip, and corporate earnings – usually a key driver of stock prices – have also been strong.

In any case, instead of reacting to external events – negative or positive – you'll help yourself by pursuing an investment strategy based

on your goals and risk tolerance. Sticking to that strategy will be easier if you follow these steps:

- Take a break from checking your statements. When the market goes through a rough patch, you may find yourself constantly check on how your portfolio is doing. But this can cause stress and lead you to make unwise decisions. If you don't need this money right now, take a break from looking at your investment statements.
- Give yourself time to make investment moves. See if you can wait a certain amount of time – a day, a night or a weekend – before making a significant investment move. This delay can give you time for strong emotions to cool and help you consider whether your decision is in your best interest.
- Take steps to protect your long-term investments. If you don't really need the money right away, you shouldn't have to worry excessively over the short-term movements of the financial markets. To avoid tapping into your long-term investments, try to build an emergency fund containing several months' worth of living expenses, with the money kept in a low-risk, easily accessible account.
- Get some help. When you're facing the ups and downs in the markets, you can benefit from some assistance. A financial advisor can discuss your concerns and illustrate some scenarios that can result if you make certain moves thereby helping you make better informed decisions.

We're living in challenging days. But instead of agonizing over things you can't control, concentrate on those that you can – such as making investment choices appropriate for your needs and capable of helping you meet your goals.
