PROPOSED BY-LAW AMENDMENTS:

to Article V and Article IX of the By-laws passed by the Board of Trustees on 4/17/2018. The current Articles read as follows:

ARTICLE V: OFFICIAL COMMITTEES *Section 1.* The Chairman of the Board will appoint a Trustee to Chair each Committee and a minimum of two members from the residents of the district. The committees will serve at the pleasure of the Board. The meetings will be noticed annually in the Bradenton Herald as well as in the Bayshore Banner, District bulletin boards, and the Official website. The committees will keep minutes of their meetings and submit an official copy of the minutes of their meeting to the District Manager as a public record. The Chairman and at least one other member must be present to constitute quorum. The members of each committee will be posted in the office of the District, published in the Banner as well as the Official Website. The Committee will prepare their own agenda and distribute to members. A copy of the agenda will be submitted to District Office to place on Website and forward to Trustees.

Section 2. All Official Committee meetings must be held at 6919 26th St. and be open to the public and properly noticed.(see Article IV, section 1 of these Bylaws)

Section 3. The Board of Trustees will charge the committees

Budget and Finance

Personnel and Salaries

Communication (Web/Banner)

Marina

Policy and Procedure

PROPOSED: ARTICLE V

STANDING COMMITTEES

With the advice and consent of the Board, the Chairman may appoint Standing Committees. Standing Committees shall be established for a specific purpose and shall report their findings of fact to the entire Board through a Trustee Liaison appointed by the Chairman. The Board, at any time, may disband any established Standing Committee. Nominations to Standing Committees may be made by any Trustee, subject to approval by the Board. The members of Standing Committees, unless removed by Board action, shall serve for the life of the Committees.

ARTICLE IX: AMENDMENTS *Section 1.* Amendments to the bylaws shall be presented in writing by a Trustee to the board in a regularly scheduled Board of Trustee meeting. The residents shall be notified by publishing proposed change/s on the Bayshore Gardens website at least 30 days prior to a vote. The proposed changes will also appear in the next Bayshore Banner and on the District Bulletin Board. The Board of Trustees shall vote on the proposed amendments at any regular or special meeting that is properly noticed after the 30 day notice.

PROPOSED: ARTICLE IX

Amendments to the bylaws shall be presented in writing by a Trustee to the board in a regularly scheduled Board of Trustee meeting. The residents shall be notified by publishing proposed change/s on the Bayshore Gardens website at least 14 days prior to a vote. The proposed changes will also appear in the next Bayshore Banner. The Board of Trustees shall vote on the proposed amendments at any regular or special meeting that is properly noticed after the 14 days notice.

MANAGER'S MINUTE:

Screen Porch Referendum on March Ballot

At the November 11, 2019 Board of Trustees Meeting, a resolution was passed by the Board to place a referendum on the March 17, 2020 ballot asking Bayshore Gardens residents if they want to approve a capital expenditure to repair and expand the screen porch, cost not to exceed \$40,000.

Several residents have asked for clarification on this matter. When an improvement to the property of the District is proposed, the District Charter mandates that any capital expenditure that exceeds \$25,000 must go to the voters of the District. This is the starting point. The outcome of the vote determines the next step. If not approved by the voters, the referendum fails. If approved, the Board of Trustees can move forward. This project will occur when District funds are available which could be a year or two down the road. The important factor is that you have approval from the residents to invest the funds for the stated improvement.

The screen porch is in poor condition. The roof is in such bad shape it must be repaired or the porch must be torn down per Code Enforcement. The southeast corner leaks from the roof and is deteriorating the wooden support beam. Many of the screens are in disrepair along with the entry doors on the east and west ends.

Our current hall contractor was consulted for a verbal estimate to obtain an approximate cost for repair and expansion. As with any project, the higher end was utilized to present a monetary figure for the referendum election.

Therefore, if the project does not occur for a period of time, the construction cost has leeway and will not need to go back to the voters due to an increase in material costs.

As many of you know, the screen porch is a rental for residents only. Many of our residents rent this venue because it is a more affordable alternative at \$25 for smaller parties than the recreation hall. Should the referendum fail, the Board must still address the aging infrastructure of the porch, as it will eventually be a liability and unsuitable for use. The porch will be torn down with no alternative rental space.

Should the referendum pass, the Board will have the authority to repair and expand this area when District funds permit. The Board would like to improve this area and keep an affordable rental space available for use by residents and their guests.

Your vote matters.

The March meeting is Monday, March 2nd at 1:00 pm for a tour of Sarasota Jungle Gardens, 3701 Bay Shore Road, Sarasota, FL 34234. Heading south on US 41, 2 miles past University Parkway, turn right on Myrtle Street and head west 3 blocks to Sarasota Jungle Gardens, turn right head north on Bay Shore Road. Entrance will be approximately 100 feet on your left. We will meet in the parking lot of the Recreation Center in order to carpool. The ticket prices are Seniors (65+) \$16.99 and Adults (17-64) \$17.99.

There were 17 present at the February meeting for a wonderful program "Wild for Wildflowers" presented by Master Gardener Norma Kisida from the Mantee Extension Services with assistance from Sylvia Bailey who is currently in training.

A wildflower is any herbaceous plant that grew wild before the 1560s. In addition to their beauty, wildflowers benefit honey bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds by providing homes, food, and nesting sites.

Weed - a plant whose virtues have never been discovered. Ralph Waldo Emerson

Norma presented photos of the many wildflowers found in Florida. We saw Tropical sage (Salvia), Ohio Spiderwort (wetlands and landscape), Lanceleaf coreopsis/tickweed (FL state wildflower), Purple coneflower, Black-eyed Susan (native and non-native) Narrowleaf Sunflower, Blazing Star, Tampa Verbena (endemic to coastal), Purple Passionflower, Lizard's tail, Swamp milkweed (must be native not tropical as a host for Monarch, Queen, and Soldier butterflies), Aquatic milkweed, Butterflyweed, Sandhill milkweed, Cardinal flower, Wild petunia, Ironweed, Stokes' Aster, Seaside Goldenrod (not to be confused with ragweed), Pine Barren Goldenrod, Chapman's Goldenrod, Beach sunflower, Blanket flower, Privet cassia (shrub), Scorpion Tail, Bluecurls, False rosemary (shrub), Dotted horsemint, FL Paintbrush, Sunshine Mimosa (groundcover), Twinflower (groundcover), FL Pennyroyal (groundcover), Creeping Sage (groundcover), Blue

Porterweed, Coral Bean (shrub), Firebush (shrub), Buttonsage (shrub), Yellow necklacepod (shrub), Bastard indigo, Coral Honeysuckle, Sky Blue Clustervine.

She emphasized that the plants must come from a native plant nursery because plants from other sources can be treated making them undesirable as hosts for honey bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds. Local native plant nurseries are Sweetbay Nursery on Erie Road in Parrish, and FL Native Plants in Myakka City.

After wildflowers are established they are low maintenance. Steps to establish wildflowers are to remove unwanted grass and weeds by covering with cardboard and mulch for 4-6 months. Select plants depending on if it's a sunny (4+ hours of sun) or shady (light daily or afternoon shade) location. The planting season is October - February.

CERT - (Community Emergency Response Team)

Manatee County Emergency Management is sponsoring Hurricane Expo 2020, a free to the public opportunity to gain important Hurricane information. The event will be in the Manatee County Convention Center, hours 3:00 to 8:00 pm. The EXPO will afford you the opportunity to learn more about Hurricane preparedness for yourself and your family. We hope you will take advantage of this event for the safety of yourself and your family. Your CERT will have a booth and we hope that you will stop in and introduce yourself.

COMMUNITY HELP NEEDED

Manatee County CERT is growing and needs our help. CERT works with the police and fire departments in its community to assist its residents in a disaster. The fire and police departments have learned from other disasters that they do not have enough man power to take care of our community without trained help. Our volunteers are trained in emergency search/rescue, first aid/cpr, and other lifesaving skills. We are qualified to assist all of the first responders. We are currently trained and certified by Manatee County. FEMA requires certification to activate with CERT.

Your community has a Team but should the need arise may be supplemented from other community CERT teams in Manatee County. All CERT members have picture ID and are required to have the ID when activated. FEMA recognizes CERT as an important part of Disaster response.

HAM Radio Operators certification classes are scheduled to start soon. Let us know if you are interested, you do not need CERT certification to operate a HAM radio in an emergency.

This may be the only help Bayshore Gardens residents will have in an emergency for the first 72 hours. Classes are free.

We meet monthly and view a short training FEMA film followed by a business meeting. Drills are held for training purposes. We also offer First Aid and CPR classes for our members. These classes are optional. We do not receive any funding for our CERT program and to provide the equipment and training we need to serve the community, we hold fund raisers several times a year.

Our CERT program is working with the County to establish the CERT Coalition of Manatee County. This effort will put the Teams, Sheriff's Dept, and Fire Depts. together to serve the total community where and when needed. This is a real win for those of us who live close to the water.

Home is Where Love Resides

Every year since 2003 our Legislature has raided the Sadowski Fund, an affordable housing trust fund created in 1992 to help pay for local and state housing programs throughout Florida. It's estimated that at least \$2 billion dollars has been diverted from this fund by our state elected officials who have used the money to help balance the state budget.

The trust fund money comes from a 0.07 percent fee on deed transfers, promissory notes and other official records, and was designed to be split 70/30 between local governments who offer down-payment assistance and housing repairs to our most vulnerable homeowners and the State. These homeowners include our veterans, the elderly and ALICE (Asset Limited Income Constrained Employed) residents who struggle to make ends meet. The 30% balance was to be allocated to state programs that help fund affordable homes. Maybe 2020 is the year that our legislators are shaken back to reality and understand that if Florida wants to continue to fuel our growing economy, our workers need housing.

Senator Mayfield and Representative Kiillebrew (Republicans from Melbourne & Winter Haven) have joined forces and sponsored SB 306 and HB 381 to pump the breaks on this unethical money sweep. So far, the bills are moving through the process with the House lagging slightly behind the Senate.

Think of some of the simple times that you have taken your home for granted, like the time your child had a fever and needed a cool bath to bring her temperature down or simply having a warm dinner before sleeping in a safe bed after a long work day.

Housing helps our families to stay together, to be employed, to educate our children, and support the health and well-being of our citizens. And when our population is cared for with a clean and decent roof over their heads, our businesses grow too. Housing is clearly too expensive when 1 out of 6 US families spends more than half their income on housing and are forced to forego other necessities, including food and medicine. These deficiencies often result in different problems that still land in the in-box of government problems to solve.

Manatee County is committed to creatively thinking outside of the box and has instituted several housing incentives like "Livable Manatee" to foster the infill development of affordable housing. We are also currently analyzing whether or not Community Land Trusts can be added to our tool-box of affordable housing solutions, and an accessory dwelling unit ordinance has gone back to the drawing board with input from the public and commissioners.

Take a minute today and call your legislators in Tallahassee and ask them to support these new bills that will prohibit lawmakers from using the Sadowski Fund for anything other than supporting affordable housing. Let's hope 2020 is the year that we decide to let the Sadowski Fund do the work it was intended to do.
