Manatee County Updates

The county advised on July 9th that the temporary bypass on the Florida Blvd. bridge should be removed in approximately two weeks after the completion of the new line and it is in service.

ADU ZONING: The Accessory Dwelling Unit proposed zoning discussed at a Board meeting by Commissioner Misty Servia, has had no further action by the Manatee County Commissioners. The County staff was directed to work on amending verbiage to bring back to the Board of Commissioners at a later time. A date for subsequent discussion has not been set.

Approved By The Board

A Special Meeting was held on July 26, 2019 by the Board of Trustees to approve the Marina Project, slated to begin on October 1, 2019. This will include dredging of the marina basin and canal along with new finger piers and dock.

The BOT also overwhelmingly approved the hall renovation. This project will begin August 5th through October 28th.





BAYSHORE GARDENS BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING MINUTES JULY 16, 2019

Trustees in attendance were: Belle Baxter, Barbara Susdorf, Jim Frost, Dan Rawlinson, Terry Zimmerly Sandy McCarthy, and Sharon Denson.

A quorum was established.

Others in attendance were Jodie Lawman, District Manager; and residents Allan Riga, Barbara Greensburg, Katey Chmiel and Charlie McCarthy.

Jim stated that it was brought to his attention that the removal of Steve Watkins from the Secretary position at the last Board meeting on June 18, 2019 was not done properly. Until he researches this procedure, Steve will remain Secretary until proper procedure is determined. Sandy, who was appointed Secretary, was advised that she does not currently hold that position until a determination can be made.

The minutes of June 18, 2019 and May 21, 2019 were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Sandy asked Terry why there is a negative number on line 4150 in the Profit and Loss Statement? Terry stated this was due to refunds given when people remove their boat from the marina.

The financials for June 2019 were approved. Jim stated that going forward he would like to create a finance committee to include a reserve fund for our aging infrastructure.

Committee Reports: The Recreation Committee is the only one that had a report. Belle Baxter advised the Board that the June 29th picnic went well and all in attendance appeared to have a good time with food selling and kids having fun on the bounce house and games. The investment in the games and prizes can be used for other District events.

Belle also reported that the swim team has had a successful year and the kids are so anxious they are ready to sign up for next year. Jennette Sparrow has done a wonderful job at building the swim team and the children love her.

The swim team banquet will be held in the recreation hall on Friday, August 6th at 6 pm. There was discussion about free swim lessons and an article appearing in the Banner advising to come to the office for registration and details. Belle stated that nothing was in place for the office to begin registration. Sharon stated that the Board approved the swim lessons so she assumed something was already in place. There was a miscommunication regarding the swim lessons and details still need to be worked out. Dan Rawlinson praised the parents of the swimmers and applauds them for their involvement and cooperation.

Trustee Resignation: Jim Frost stated that he received a letter of resignation from Jim Couey who has resigned from his board seat. The opening on the board will be advertised in the Banner. If interested, you may send a letter of intent to the office and it will be forwarded to the Board for review.

District Manager Report: Jodie advised the Board that out of four delinquent boats in the marina, two have been sold, leaving the District with two.

With the assistance of Jim Frost, the office has obtained a new copier at a better price than the existing one. The current lease is up in August.

Jodie let the Board know that the office has had some issues with the Clubs reserving the hall and then cancelling one week before the event. This has resulted in

lost revenue to the District for hall rentals which were denied due to the club occupying a time/date. She believes that better advertising of club events will boost club attendance events and stated that the office will assist in adverting in the bulletin boards, Banner and on the website. Jim would like to schedule a time to meet with the clubs and go over proper procedures.

Jodie introduced the Board to a Public Records Policy which was created by the State of Florida Comptrollers office and used by every Clerk of Court's office in the State of Florida. This policy is in depth with the statute and case law and even itemizes items exempt from a public records request. The office is using this policy as guidance for Public Records requests and procedure is in place with a log noting all the details of a request and compliance. Jim advised that the Board will need to review the Public Records Policy and approve it.

It was noted that the SBA (small boat area) has had another break-in. Jodie advised the Board that the office highly encourages each boat owner to lock their vessel to the stands, as placement in the reserved area is at your own risk.

Jodie discussed the lack of communication with clubs and committees and requested that when something is put in the Banner referring residents to the office for information and/or sign up that the office please be advised in advance so that they are prepared and can do what is expected of them.

It was also brought to the attention of the committees that we are a tax- exempt organization and when making purchases on behalf of the District they can obtain a copy of the Tax Exempt Certificate from the office to avoid paying sales tax and save the District money.

Jodie requested Board permission for overtime for a maintenance man to be here on Saturday and Sunday when the lift is rented to fix lights in the marina and grounds. By renting the lift on a Friday, the District incurs a one day rental fee with return on Monday. This gives us basically 2 free days at \$303 per day. Maintenance overtime for \$16 hours is still cheaper than \$303 per day. Board approved the overtime.

Marina Bids: The sealed bids for the marina dredging and replacement of the finger piers, docks and fishing pier were opened. Below is an itemized list of the sealed bids. Some bidders only do dredging; some only docks. This explains the discrepancy in pricing.

Black rap around the pools and galvanized bolts will be included.

Above bids have multiple options available to them. Some bids include all work, some were a la carte and were added together for totals.

The bids will be reviewed by the Marina Committee and narrowed to three. Someone asked if they must take the lowest bid? There is no obligation to take the lowest bid. Jim stated that as a Board we can choose anything and although it may be the lowest, they can come in with a lot of change orders which will increase the initial price. He further stated that whomever is chosen by the Board will have a cap on change orders. The dredging cost will go up because they were relying on a 2016 survey. We know the cubic yards of sludge to be removed has increased. The District will get a new survey and have a survey done after the dredging. The cost for 2 surveys was approved by the Board for \$10,000.

Pool Area Requests: The lifeguards have asked the Board for speakers in the pool area to play music during operation hours and a baby changing station in the restroom. The motion was passed to purchase and place a baby changing station in the restroom not to exceed \$300. The speakers will be tabled until next month. Research needs to be done determining if background music is permitted in the pool area.

Hall Remodel: Jim stated he had a copy of the hall plans is anyone would like to see them. He stated the remodel job will be going out for bid. New windows are included in the bid which will be energy efficient. The shutters will be removed once the hurricane reinforced windows are in place. The scope of work includes: installing two new exterior doors, updating the bathrooms, new ceiling and moving the gas furnaces from the ceiling to the floor level. He will let the Board know when the bids come in.

Policies: Sharon stated there are two policies that have been discussed at committee. Policy 1010R has one change, item 14 which previously stated "no food or alcoholic beverages in the pool area. The change is "no food or alcohol beverages on the upper pool deck area." Sharon made a motion to correct the pool rules. Motion passed.

The second policy to be amended is the Banner Policy #1017P. The changes are the number of Banners to be printed. It will now state a minimum of 1400 and a maximum of 2000 and it can be decided by the Board Chair. The motion passed unanimously.

Jim made a motion to do away with the Banner all together and go digital. It will run its course the next three months. Those who still want the Banner can provide the office with their email address to receive it digitally. That way our out of town residents can receive the emailed Banner and keep up on District news/events. The Banner will still be available on the District's website. Those who would like a paper copy can contact the office with their address and it will be mailed to them. This will eliminate Banners sitting in driveways, unopened and unread. The Banner going digital was passed by the majority of the Board.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:00 pm.

3 Ways to Build Equity



County Gearing Up To Install 3 New Lift Station Pumps!

The planning is only in the beginning stages ... and Bayshore Gardens residents should be aware of developments on the County proposal to replace the failing lift station, add 2 more pumps, and streamline the entire system. Replacing this station has to happen--there's no getting around it.

July 3rd, Board Committee night, a team from the County headed by Jeff Goodwin, Deputy Director County Utilities, met with Trustees to give us an idea of what they may be proposing.

We saw visuals and were told a 100' x 100', by 6' high fence would enclose the lift stations. They said the station is supposed to be practically odor free due to new technology, low noise, and low visibility except for a tower and (now) larger generator for power failure.

THIS MATTER IS going to need a lot of consideration; from the county, their engineers, from the Board and most importantly, from YOU, the residents who support the park.

The County is engaging an outside engineering firm to design this system. One scenario is to improve on the current location if possible.

One proposed location is the NE corner of the ball field: We measured 100' x 100' at the corner and found the east side is only 63' to the WATER; that it takes up 1/3 of the ball field length (from the oak trees), and over 1/2 of the width! (The current station is 67 feet to the water)

This would be in plain sight of at least 12 to 18 homes or more with NO fences; the District Rec. Hall, the boaters, our residents and children going to and from the Rec. Center for activities. Note: Our park IS well attended.

An "industrial" looking installation would be right in the middle of everything, in plain site.

Would this be conducive to a nice environment for camily life-style; any life-style, in a residential neighborhood? Would it block out a class marina?

This scenario would cause our ball field to be defunct and limit choices of what we could do with it in the future. It could well be a real eyesore if County maintenance and complete concealment is not carried out. (Witness County maintenance at the current station.)

Questions arise: What about the easement granted to the County by the District many years ago? Will they look into better utilizing that area? IF the new pumps and needed equipment, tanks, utilities are engineered according to what the County promises, this would be a relief to the 3 homes closest to the current pump now—no odor, no noise, no noisy trucks when break-downs occur and (maybe) not the eyesore it is now.

WHY is a space of 10,000 square feet needed to house 3 pumps — each accompanied by big underground tanks? Why can't they can be lined up in sequence and serviced from one side like it has been for (60?) years?

And if the station has a low profile as stated; is landscaped to completely conceal fences, the adjacent residents may not need their fences to block out any ugliness (that now exist); no odor, minimal noise and have better air-flow into their yards. This will occur IF the new system is all that is now being promised.

The proposed ball field position was found to be no further from the water than the current station; which was one of the County's big reason' for moving it.

Another question is would having a big enclosure be conducive to keeping big equipment and vehicles inside?

They are looking for every option that could work. It's not unheard of to have a great idea just pop up "from someone in the crowd". What do you, the residents, say?

OUR PARK IS OUR "FRONT YARD" and we're proud of it. We pay to keep it beautiful and working to our benefit. We're renovating our marina, a big ticket itemone of our "show pieces". Why hide it?

Email your Board, email your County officials, COME TO BOARD MEETINGS. This may be an emotional issue for some of us, BUT keep it business-like and you have a better chance of being heard and getting responses.

Let's see some of that Bayshore grit!


3. Host a housewarming party.
