GARDEN CLUB MINUTES

We held our March 3rd Meeting in the Hall. Twelve members attended. Marlene Durgin, President, opened the meeting at 1:00. We pledged our allegiance to the flag.

Marlene thanked Gwen for arranging the table/chair set-up in the Board Room. Jeanne Corbin was thanked for her refreshments that included a baked dish.

The minutes from the February 3rd Meeting were available for review. Marie Young moved to accept the Minutes. Jeanne Corbin seconded the motion.

Gwen asked if we could give a small gift to the volunteers who present to us. Some suggestions were Gift Certificate to a Restaurant or Nursey, or a small gift like a window thermometer. Since the meeting Gwen contacted the Master Gardner Office to discuss protocol. The Master Gardener's office suggested that we show our support by attending their upcoming Semi-Annual Plant Sale benefiting their Program.

Everyone filed their dish with the refreshments and got their drinks before the presentation.

Marlene Durgin gave a presentation on the Atala Butterfly. The butterfly was thought to be extinct between 1937 and 1959, then found in south Florida.

The Coontie plant, a cycad, is the Atala's host plant. Coontie plants are a prehistoric, native plant. This plant is used in landscaping in roadway medians, commercial buildings, and home landscapes. The Coontie plant seeds are orange on what appears to be a pinecone on the ground. The seeds can be gathered from female cones, dried for 6-7 weeks then planted. Marlene shared instruction sheets on starting a new Coontie plant from seed. The seeds are very toxic to animals and humans.

Marlene passed around an Atala butterfly that had perished naturally. It is a black butterfly with light blue spots, iridescent sheen in blue/teal on the underside of the wings and orange tail. The sheen is more teal on a male butterfly, females bluer. She said the butterflies are friendly and would land on her hand. Their natural habitat includes southern Florida, and Caribbean islands. A festival was held for the Atala Butterfly in Jupiter the first of March.

The female Atala lays up to 60 eggs at a time in clusters. Newly hatched larvae of the Atala butterfly are tiny pale and flesh colored. The mature caterpillar sports a bright red/orange, covering with yellow spots. Their chrysalis stage appears like a bag of dodo hanging on the plant. The white-flowered plants seem to attract the Atala butterfly more than other colors.

Marlene brought bright red blooming Salvia plants to give away. The Salvia Coccinea plant is a pollinator plant for butterflies and others that likes well dried soil and are easy to care for. We each chose a plant when our name was drawn.

Marlene also gave away two scorpion tail plants. It is a flowering plant with white flowers on a 'tail' that resemble a scorpion's coiled tail. It is native to Florida, Texas, Central and South America. They like well-drained soil, also.

We thanked Marlene for her presentation and her generosity of sharing the plants.

Mary Spoutz brought Crinum Lily bulbs. She passed bulbs to the members to take as many as they wish. She said that they can get five to six feet tall. Thank you, for the bulbs, Mary - A very generous gesture.

Suzanna suggested that she announce the April Meeting/presentation in NextDoor for those interested. The only comment was the number of refreshments needed would be hard to be determined.

Joyce passed around the latest Roster, in progress, for review and input. She will work on a final product soon.

We adjourned at 2:15 pm.

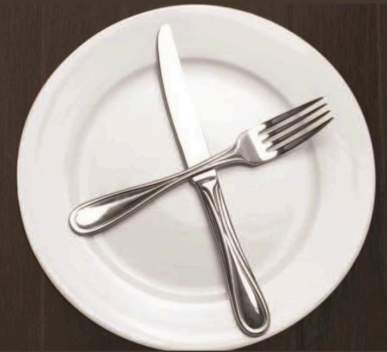
