Preliminaries - Roll call was taken, and a quorum was established. Meeting was called to order at 7:02 PM by Chairman Morris Raymer. The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

Trustees Attending - Jeanne Murphy, Barbara Greenberg, Barbara Susdorf, Terry Zimmerly, Melanie Woodruff, Morris Raymer, Dan Rawlinson, Belle Baxter, & Kyle Weatherly.

Also Attending - Gia Cruz, District Office Manager.

Chairman Morris Raymer appointed Jeanne Murphy as Recreation Chair and asked for a volunteer to take the position of Secretary. Belle Baxter volunteered to be Secretary. M. Woodruff made a **motion made to elect Belle Baxter as Secretary. Jeanne Murphy Seconded. Motion Passed, Unanimously.** The Chairman appointed Gia Cruz as Custodian of Records.

Approval of Minutes - D. Rawlinson made a **motion to approve the minutes from the February 7th Special Board Meeting. K. Weatherly Seconded. Motion Passed, Unanimously.** D Rawlinson made a **motion to approve the minutes from the February 23rd Board Meeting. K. Weatherly Seconded. Motion Passed, Unanimously.** D. Rawlinson made a **motion to approve the minutes from the March 9th Work Session. K. Weatherly Seconded. Motion Passed 8-1, B. Greenberg voted no.**

Treasurer's Report - T. Zimmerly make a **resolution to combine monies from Pool ADA Compliance reserves (\$125,000), Screen Porch Roof repair reserves(\$5,000), Pool Repair reserves (\$31,670) to create a sum of \$161,670 for pool repair/capital outlay. B. Baxter Seconded. Motion Passed 8-1, B. Greenberg voted no.**

There is also \$91,000 in this year's reserves that can be used. Money may have to be taken from the next fiscal year's reserves. The final auditor's report will show where there may be more available funds.

Budget meetings will be held Tuesday and Wednesday April 5 & 6. There was discussion about increasing the annual assessment. There was also discussion about creating more trust between the Board and the Community.

M. Woodruff made a **motion to approve the financials. J. Murphy Seconded. Motion Passed 8-1, B. Greenberg voted no.**

Committee Reports

Policy & Procedure - M. Woodruff repeated Marina Vessel Slip Deposit Contract (1005SDC) and Marina Boat Slip Agreement (1005C) are going back to Committee.

House & Grounds - K. Weatherly reported the lawyer's contract has been sent to Xecutive Pools for review.

M. Woodruff requested and received support from the Board to review attorney fees in light of some information that was sent by an Associate may have been incorrect and contrary to information from Attorney Rudacille. Policy & Procedure Committee will be a meeting to discuss this on Tuesday, April 12.

BG Garden Club Minutes for April 4, 2022

This gathering was a field trip to Tropiflora Nursery (3530 Tallevast Rd, Sarasota, FL 34243). This adventure was arranged by Joyce Fisher. Thank you, Joyce. Six were in attendance. We gathered at the Recreation Hall parking area at 1:00 and left in two cars for the nursery. No monthly reports were given at this time.

Tropiflora specializes in bromeliads, tillandsias and other exotic plants. Scott gave a very informative tour of the facility with the help of his sister, Robin, and mother, Linda. They started out as a mail order business and have been open 46 years. They are the most renown in the world having 4,000 to 7,000 types of bromeliads and thousand types of air plants. Seasonally they sell ferns and other exotic plants from partnering vendors. We learned that Tropiflora supplied thousands of plants to the Gardens by the Bay, Singapore, for their Super Trees.

The nursery maintains and creates new colors

for their bromeliads in large, netted shelters under filtered light. The plants are suspended off the ground eliminating nematode problems and for ease of inspection and maintenance.

The bromeliads' soil needs to be fertilized with a time released fertilizer yearly and the air plant is saturated with a weak water-soluble fertilizer monthly. The thicker and hardier the bromeliad leaf is, the more it can tolerate the sun. Thin leaves must be kept out of the sun as do the air plants.

We thank Scot, Robin, and Linda for a very informative tour. We bought our favorite species to take home.

Next month, May 2, 2022, we will meet at the Hall at 1:00 and carpool to Mable Ringling's Rose Garden (5401 Bay Shore Rd, Sarasota, FL 34243). May is the best time to see the roses. We will receive an arm band for this free self-touring event. This adventure is selected by Gwen Norris. Of course, if there is inclement weather, we may make a last-minute change.

MANATEE MATTERS WITH COMMISSIONER MISTY SERVIA

Our Homeless Problem.

"I'm 62-years old, disabled with Multiple Sclerosis and I'm about to be homeless. Please. Can you help me?"

This is what I heard from a woman on the other end of the phone as I juggled my grocery cart and shopping bags last Saturday morning.

For the next 10 minutes I listened to her story. The rent is going up and she can't afford to live in her home. Her monthly income is \$1,535.00. Her family has helped out when they can, but they are now dealing with their own financial crisis and don't have any extra money to share. She told me that she has been searching for an apartment or mobile home, but her current income is too low to qualify for a new place. She heard the same story after searching in Tampa but was able to get on a waiting list - and they expect to have a unit available in December or January - but she will officially be homeless on May 8th.

"Do you have family or friends who can help you?", I asked. "No", she replied. "Not even a couch that you can sleep on until you can secure another place?" " I don't" she said, "and I'm really scared."

I promised that I would connect her via email to the local agencies who focus on preventing and addressing homelessness as soon as I got home. It didn't feel like enough. Helping people through challenging circumstances is one of the things I enjoy most in my role as a commissioner, but I feel helpless when I get a call from someone losing their home, because the options are slim to none.

Last week the County Commission took big steps forward to address homelessness. We approved a Homeless Coordinator position to work with the many non-profit agencies who serve the homeless and authorized a case manager position to work hand-in-hand with Deputy Joy Jewett. Deputy Jewett spends her days walking the homeless camps, tracking people, documenting their next of kin, and

sometimes trespassing them from private property. She now has a case manager, so when she comes across someone willing to accept help - she can hand them off to a social worker who will plug them into services. This will hopefully reduce the cycle of arrest, release, and back on the streets.

Most of the chronically homeless need help with addiction or mental health services and getting them to accept help is a barrier to addressing the problem, as they lack insight into their psychiatric problems. But you know what is really frightening about our current local situation? Approximately ⅓ of our newly homeless people are first timers.

The Board also authorized the County Administrator to reach out to Bradenton and Palmetto in partnership and initiate a study with the Florida Housing Coalition to develop a housing crisis response system. This will provide us with a recipe for chipping away at the massive problem.

And we authorized the 2022-23 county funding for the "Suncoast Partnership to End Homelessness" to go directly to them instead of taking the Partnership through the standard competitive process. The Suncoast Partnership is the regional agency, (federally designated as the "Continuum of Care") for Sarasota and Manatee Counties.

Finally, we created a Homeless Crisis Task Force as an arm of the Public Safety Council so that the key players can communicate on a regular basis.

I was extremely proud of the Board for supporting these first steps and I'm confident these moves will have a positive impact.

The woman I spoke of at the beginning of this piece will weigh on my heart along with the

others I've talked with, but as I wrap up this writing - listening to Eric Clapton's, "Running on Faith" - I received word that a 3-generation family with a disabled daughter - who were facing life on the streets by the end of May - have secured housing.

*"Lately I've been running on faith.
What else can a poor boy do?
But my world will be right - when love comes over you."*
