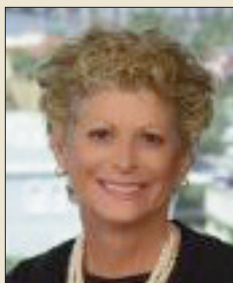

## 11 Tips for Creating Wildlife Habitat at Home

1. Determine how much space you are willing to devote to wildlife habitat. Be sure to consider all your current uses such as areas for children's play, pets and other recreation.
2. Make a list of wildlife that visit your property and those you would like to attract. Provide the elements of good habitat essential to all wildlife – food, water, shelter and space.
3. Plant a variety of native trees and other plants to supply year-round nectar flowers, fruits and nuts. Native wildlife are adapted to native plants.
4. Limit your use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides.
5. Avoid planting invasive nonnative plants and slowly replace those in your yard with native species.
6. Include plantings for hummingbirds, butterflies and other insect pollinators.
7. Ensure water is clean and plentiful.
8. Leave standing dead trees and stumps or rotting logs where possible to provide nesting cavities and basking sites.
9. Build healthy topsoil by mulching.
10. Become inspired by visiting some natural areas managed by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission.

### MINUTES OF MEETING June 21 2016

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Bayshore Gardens Park and Recreation District was called to order by Chairman Maynard Boyce at 7:00 PM and was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Notice of the meeting was posted in the June Bayshore Banner.

Roll: Dan Rawlinson, Kathy Lokos, Debbie Korell, Maynard Boyce, Richard Nelson, Terry Zimmerly, Jonna Koellhoffer and Vickie Ford.

A quorum was established.

Present: Joanne Manse, Steve Watkins, Suzanna Young, Lee Korniluk and Adam Hange

Debbie made a motion to approve the May minutes. Kathy seconded. **Motion passed.**

Kathy made a motion to approve the May financials. Dan seconded. **Motion Passed.**

Kathy reported some of the monies in the reserve accounts have been spent on repairs so we need to move money from the reserve accounts to the general fund.

Transfer \$6,300 from Pool Reserve, \$45,000 from Parking Lot Reserve, \$3,000 from Legal Fees, \$19,000 from Marina Reserve Fund. Debbie made a motion to move the monies to the general fund. Terry seconded. **Motion passed.**

**BGNA: Dan Rawlinson**  
Dan reported they had their first pizza pool party. Other pizza parties are scheduled for July 8<sup>th</sup> and August 12<sup>th</sup>. There will be no BGNA meetings until September.

**CRIME WATCH: Steve Watkins**  
Steve reported they found that someone tried to steal a boat from a lift on the canal. A neighbor retrieved the boat after it would not start. CW called the sheriff and notified the owner. **Next meeting is July 12 at 7:00 pm.**

**RESTORE BAYSHORE: Suzanna Young**  
Suzanna reported there will be a School Board Candidate Forum July 20, 2016, at 6:30 pm. They are also discussing speeding signs. Suzanna displayed a colorful sign for the Kayak Storage Area. It will be an 18"x24" sign, and a printer will make the sign for \$25.00. Vickie made a motion to purchase the sign. Debbie seconded. **Motion passed.**

Next meeting is July 11<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm.

### MANAGER'S REPORT:

**Maynard Boyce for Joanne Manse**  
Maynard stated there are still issues with homeowners at the pool. Part of the problem is not understanding English. Kathy made a motion to have pool and slide rules also written in Spanish. Jonna seconded. **Motion passed.**

**BUDGET & FINANCE: Kathy Lokos**

No meeting. No report. Next meeting will be in October.

**WEB/BANNER: Dan Rawlinson**

No report. Next meeting July 13<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 pm.

**MARINA: Richard Nelson/Debbie Korell**  
Debbie stated they had a presentation from Mark Kinkaid of Coastal Engineering. Debbie stated they discussed expanding the marina project to include the design on the center pier. This would give us a complete design of the whole marina. The increase in cost to do this would be \$8,300.00. If we decided at a later date to hire an engineer to design the center pier, the cost would be \$21,000.00. Debbie made a motion to include the center pier design not to exceed \$9,000.00. Vickie seconded. **Motion passed.** Debbie made a motion to present to Coastal Engineering a new boat launch design to make it two feet wider. Kathy seconded. **Six for and one against. Next meeting will be Wednesday June 29<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm**

**HOUSE & GROUNDS: Maynard Boyce**  
Maynard stated if we want to go to the legislature to have the spending limit raised to more than \$25,000.00, we are required to have a vote from the homeowners first. Maynard stated we were able to get two quotes for striping the parking lot. Dan made a motion to accept the bid from Asphalt Maintenance for \$3,711.00. Debbie seconded. **Motion passed.** This will include placement of 87 wheel stops, striping for 8 handicap spaces, and 8 handicap signs. Debbie reported they contacted 10-12 different construction firms for construction of an ADA bathroom in the hall. They sent out 6 RFP's and got three back. Debbie made a motion to accept the bid from Final Draft for \$19,000.00. Kathy seconded. **Motion passed.** We have a proposal from Goodson Electric to replace wiring at

the pool pump. Maynard would like to have them put in new conduit instead of using the existing. The office will get in touch with Goodson to get a new proposal including the conduit. Kathy made a motion to approve the \$2,100.00. Dan seconded. **Motion passed.** Dan reported the ceiling in the office needs to be taken down. There is mold and it needs to be removed. The board suggested that we call Final Draft and several other contractors to give us a quote to remove the ceiling. **Next meeting will be July 14<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 pm.**

**PERSONNEL & SALARY: Dan Rawlinson**  
Debbie stated she would like to revisit the kitchen issue. She would like to limit the use of the kitchen during the week to the staff and any clubs that have reserved the hall for that week. There is now a policy in place that if the kitchen is left dirty there will be a \$75.00 fee to have the kitchen cleaned. We will have a checklist in place to be looked at several times a week. **Next meeting will be July 13<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 pm**

**OLD BUSINESS:** Kathy stated we should have our attorney work on contractual indemnity verbiage to be added to our contracts with vendors. Steve stated he invited a deputy to come to our board meeting. The deputy was not able to attend. The board thought anything like this should be at a committee meeting not a board meeting.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Kathy asked Maynard if he decided on giving up the House and Grounds Chair. The majority of the board feels that he is stretched to thin and would be a better chairman if he didn't have so much responsibility. After a lengthy discussion, Maynard asked Vickie Ford if she would like to be the chairman. Again, after another lengthy discussion, Vickie accepted the position.

**Next meeting is July 19, 2016, at 7:00 pm.**

Maynard requested a motion to adjourn. Terry made the motion and Jonna seconded. Meeting adjourned 9:56 pm.

Hello from the hills of the North Atlanta Metro Area. An earlier than expected deadline finds me out of town and borrowing equipment to get this article out for print. Since the Board of trustees meeting hasn't happened yet I won't be reporting on anything that they approved reference our marina project. The Marina Committee met on a couple of occasions and has another meeting slated in June to meet again with Coastal Engineering. The purpose of this meeting is to further define the plan for the work to be done. The South Work Area should be down to one boat since the others should have gone back into the water around mid June.

The sale of the Luhrs fishing boat for nonpayment of fees was a success with the sale price covering the fees, overdue charges, and other cost associated with the selling of the boat. Speaking of the sale, it took place in the morning as Tropical Storm Colin was approaching. Colin was more of

a nuisance than anything else. There was minimum damage to the marina with the biggest things being higher than usual tides and multiple planks floating away from our docks. The 4<sup>th</sup> of July holiday will be upon us when this article is distributed, so I will say, everybody please have a safe and happy holiday.

**Reminders** – Please remember to keep your boat registration and insurance documents, as well as your parking decal information (vehicle registration and proof of insurance), up to date with the office. Fishing around the piers and boats in the Marina Basin is prohibited. Designated fishing areas are the North and South Seawalls where the channel enters the basin. I hope to have these marked in the near future. Also, fishing is permitted off of the dock at the fish cleaning station. There are going to be gate key checks coming up, most probably, weekends and/or holidays.

## Improvements, Repairs and Projects Completed

–Several planks were located and reattached or replaced on the finger piers. A few center pier planks were reattached. Several posts are to be replaced on the Launch Ramp pier and a finger pier. The boat work stands are being reworked. Cleaned, painted, greased, and new pads put on.

# Restore Bayshore Reports

Meeting commenced Monday, June 13 at 6:30 pm. Seven enthusiastic residents were on board.

Our usual guests, Neighborhood Services, were not able to make the meeting.

We first discussed some of the plans for the School Board Candidate Forum. All is set except for a two more volunteers to help with sign-in at the door and someone to time speaker (we have 8 candidates to speak and must watch the time).

It was decided to ask if Channel 7 can be here. Suzanna sent a notice to the online "paper", the Bradenton Times, and will notify the Bradenton Herald. A notice will go into Neighborhood Service's online newsletter which features com-

munity activities throughout the county.

Positioning of current "traffic" signs seems to be okay with Code Enforcement.

One of the residents shared good news. She has been talking with Sgt. Michael Kenyon, in Traffic Management. They may be running a monitor in the foreseeable future which will record the number of vehicles and their speed on 26th Street.

There was some discussion again of design. An accepted theme was simplicity and message.

Someone suggested a standard format and then stencil the symbol below; one or two words on a color background with a symbol or silhouette that indicated the subject a driver was to watch for. We have to make our \$100 donation go as far as possible.

**Next meeting will be July 11 at 6:30 pm. Meeting adjourned at 7:30 pm.**

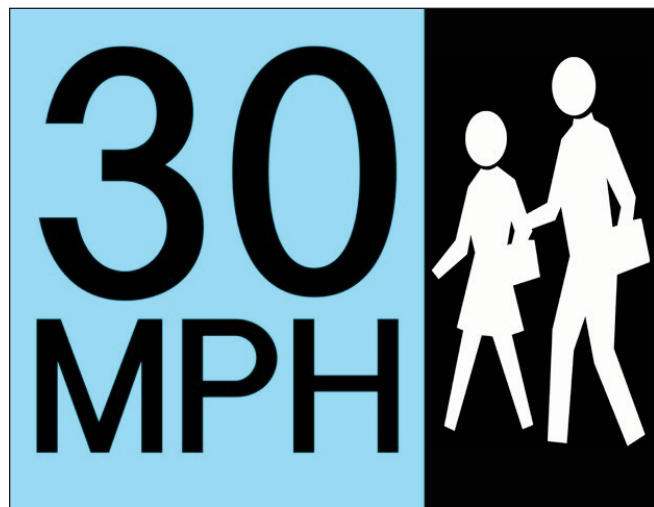

Their wedding invitation in St. Croix read: "Two lives, two hearts, sailed together in friendship, united forever in love".

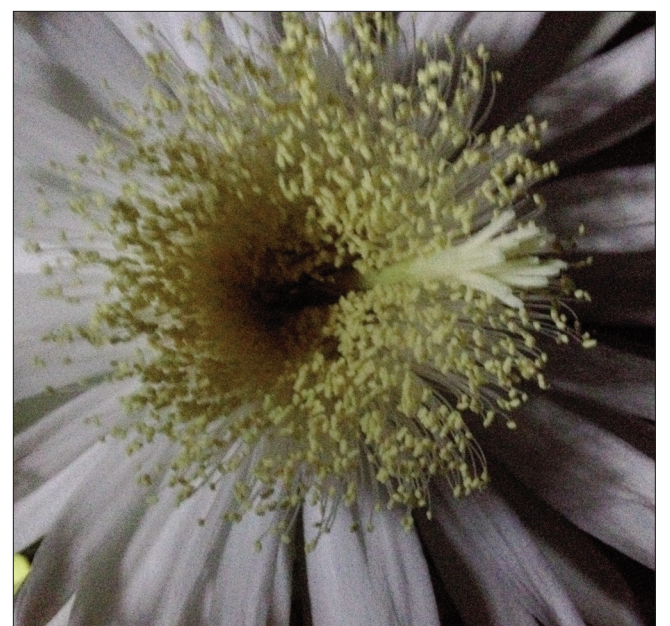
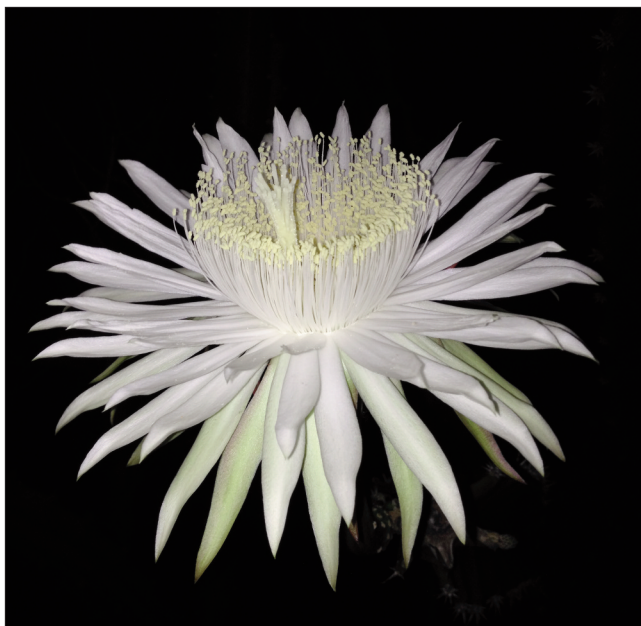

## Florida Yards & Neighborhoods Program

The Florida Yards & Neighborhoods Program was created from a citizens' education and action program after learning of research conducted by the Natural Estuary Programs of Sarasota and Tampa Bays. The research indicates that 54% of nitrogen pollution entering our bays and estuaries comes from stormwater run-off, with 60% of that runoff nitrogen coming from residential landscapes. Nitrogen pollution contributes to the decline of our bays. This program is administered through the Cooperative Extension Service of the University of Florida's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences (IFAS) which includes:

- A self-help assistance program for homeowners which provides literature and advice by trained volunteer Master Gardeners (called Florida Yard Advisors);
- Model Florida Yards throughout the community to demonstrate and promote appropriate landscape design and maintenance

- An educational campaign to market Florida Yards & Neighborhoods concepts

Your participation helps us to provide you with specific advice for your landscape. If you would like to receive a Florida Yard Recognition, please fill out a Yardstick Checklist available at: [http://manatee.ifas.ufl.edu/FYN/PDFs/FYN-Yard\\_Checklist.pdf](http://manatee.ifas.ufl.edu/FYN/PDFs/FYN-Yard_Checklist.pdf) and return it to us. Our office will schedule a visit to your Florida Yard. The FMNP consists of three Core Modules:

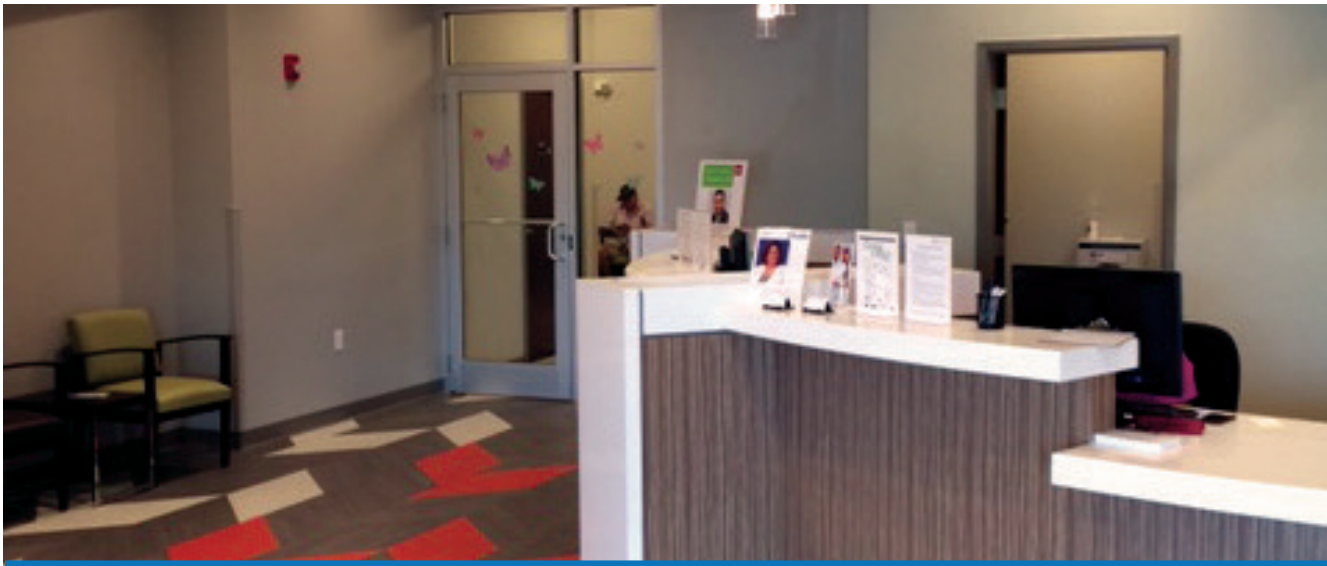

## Powel Crosley, Jr. Community Exhibition: His Life. His Work. His Impact.

The community exhibition runs until September 30 (except for the Manatee County Central Library's exhibit, which will run through August 31). For those who visit all six sites and get an entry card stamped, turning the card in at the last site visited, will be entered to win a replica Crosley radio!

After graduating from the Ohio Military Institute in 1905, Powel Crosley, Jr. attended the University of Cincinnati before dropping out to focus on the mechanics of automobiles. He was particularly fascinated with mass production techniques used by Henry Ford. Crosley worked for several auto manufacturing companies before starting the American Automobile Accessory Company with Ira J. Cooper in 1916.

Crosley, along with his brother Lewis, implemented many new ideas for marketing and business growth including a "money back guarantee" and the use of independent local dealers. By 1921, Crosley changed from a small time salesman never making more than \$50 per week to amassing a fortune selling auto parts through direct mail.

Crosley then ventured into radio production. His son wanted a wireless radio, but Crosley refused to pay \$100 or more for "a toy." When Crosley and his son built their own radio using a book entitled, "The ABC of Radio," Crosley recognized the appeal of inexpensive radios. He began manufacturing radio parts and created the first low-priced crystal set which he called the "Harko." This made the radio available to most Americans.

Crosley went into radio broadcasting to sell more

radios and at 500,000 watts had the most powerful station in the world. His radio station – The Nation's Station, WLW – was the proving ground for the early careers of many who went on to global stardom. His television station became the first NBC affiliate, and Crosley's own Cincinnati Reds baseball team became the first sports program ever broadcast in color.

By the end of his life in 1961, Crosley had invented, developed, manufactured or produced the second car radio (Motorola was first), first push-button radio, early soap operas, first non-electric refrigerator (Icyball), first refrigerator with shelves in the door (Shelvador), most powerful commercial radio station ever (WLW, at 500 kW), first lights on a major league baseball field, newspapers broadcast by radio-FAX (Reado), first American car to have disc brakes, and also phonographs, scalp massagers, canoes, furniture, baby carriages, washing machines, stoves and bed-cooling systems.

In 1929, Crosley built a winter home in Manatee County, Florida for his wife, Gwendolyn. It was designed under the auspices of New York architect, George Albree Freeman, Jr. by Ivo A. deMinicis and built by Paul Bergman.

Named Sea Gate, the two-and-a-half-story Mediterranean mansion was built on a 60-acre parcel of land on Sarasota Bay adjacent to the John Ringling Estate. The 11,000-square-foot home has 21 rooms and 10 baths, and an adjacent carriage house has room for three cars and servants' quarters on the second floor. Originally the mansion had a swimming pool, a seaplane dock and yacht

basin.

The home featured many innovations for its time, including a steel frame encased in cast stone, a telephony system in the house and servant's quarters, electrical wiring under the tiles in the floors to provide power for table and standing lamps, and a 135-day construction schedule. It also has a more rustic, Tuscan feel including stenciled pecky cypress beams, galleon carvings on the porches, large carved doors, terra cotta tile floors in unique designs, plaster ornamentation, and stained glass windows.

After his wife died of tuberculosis at Sea Gate in 1939, Crosley no longer visited the house. During World War II, the property was used by the Army Air Corps as a retreat for men learning to fly fighter planes at the military airfield located nearby. Following the war, the property was sold to Mabel and Freeman Horton. The family lived there until the 1980s when a condominium project was proposed for the site.

Placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1982, Seagate was purchased for renovation by Manatee County in 1991.

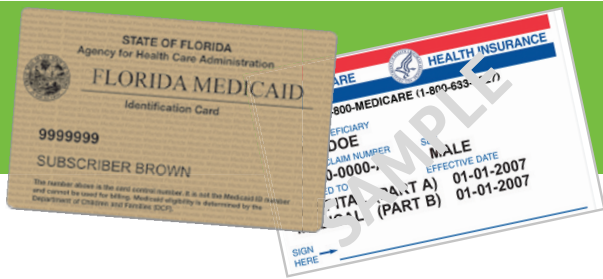

# Summer Picnic Recipes

## Chile-Lime Cornwheels

1/3 c. extra-virgin olive oil  
6 cloves garlic, sliced  
2-3 dried red chiles, lightly crushed  
2 tsp. lime zest + lime wedges for serving  
Kosher salt  
4 ears sweet corn

Heat oil, garlic, and chiles in a small saucepan over medium heat until garlic is just beginning to turn golden brown, 2 to 3 minutes. Remove from heat and stir in lime zest. Season with salt. Cook corn in a large pot of boiling salted water until tender, 5 to 8 minutes; drain. Slice into 1 1/2" disks. Serve corn drizzled with garlic oil and lime wedges alongside.

## Salty Peanut Banana Pudding

1/3 c. all-purpose flour, spooned and leveled  
1/4 tsp. fine salt; 2/3 c. + 3 tbsp. sugar  
1 3/4 c. whole milk, 4 lg. egg yolks  
1 3/4 c. heavy cream divided  
1/3 c. Creamy Peanut Butter  
3 tsp. pure vanilla extract, divided  
50 vanilla wafers

4 med. ripe bananas, sliced  
3/4 c. chopped roasted, salted peanuts  
Whisk together flour, salt, and 2/3 cup sugar in medium saucepan. Whisk in milk, egg yolks, and 1/2 cup cream. Cook over medium heat, whisking constantly, until thickened and a pudding like consistency, 7 to 9 minutes. Remove from heat and whisk in peanut butter and 2 tps vanilla. Arrange 25 wafers (slightly overlapping) in the bottom of an 8-by-8-inch baking pan. Top with half of banana slices, 1/4 cup peanuts. Cover and chill 4 hours or up to overnight. Whisk remaining 3 tablespoons sugar, 1 1/4 cups cream, and 1 teaspoon vanilla on medium high with an electric mixer just until stiff peaks form, 2 to 3 minutes. Spread over top. Sprinkle with remaining 1/4 cup peanuts.

## Avocado and Ham Sandwiches

2 loaf ficelle  
1/4 c. butter  
2 tbsp. Dijon mustard  
.13 tsp. coarse black pepper  
3/4 lb. Virginia ham  
3 large avocados

Cut each ficelle loaf into 3 equal pieces, and split each horizontally along one side, leaving the other side intact. Open the pieces so they lie flat. Stir the butter, mustard, and pepper together until smooth, and spread on both sides of the bread. Layer with the ham and avocado, and sprinkle with the sea salt. Wrap the sandwiches with parchment, and tie with a string to secure. Keep chilled and serve within 3 hours.

## Shrimp Wrap with Melon-Cucumber Relish

1 lb. medium shrimp  
1/4 c. fresh cilantro  
1 tsp. salt  
1 tsp. fresh-ground black pepper  
1 tsp. cumin  
1/4 tsp. cinnamon  
2 tbsp. vegetable oil  
4 10-inch sandwich wraps  
1/4 c. Curry-Dijon Mayonnaise

1 c. Melon-Cucumber Relish  
Sauté the shrimp: In a large bowl, toss shrimp with cilantro, salt, pepper, cumin, and cinnamon. In a large skillet over high heat, heat oil. Add shrimp to the hot oil and sauté, stirring occasionally, until cooked through -- 3 to 4 minutes. Assemble the wraps: On a clean work surface, place 4 wraps and spread 1 tablespoon of Curry-Dijon Mayonnaise on each. Place 4 to 6 shrimp on each wrap. Top the shrimp with 1/4 cup of Melon-Cucumber Relish and fold the wraps into sandwiches.

## Tangy Collard and Cabbage Slaw

1 red onion, thinly sliced  
1/4 c. cider vinegar  
2 tbsp. whole grain mustard  
1 1/2 tbsp. Honey  
2/3 c. olive oil  
Kosher salt

Freshly ground black pepper  
1 small bunch collard greens, stems discarded and leaves shredded  
1/2 small head green cabbage, shredded  
6 slices thick-cut bacon, cooked and crumbled

Combine onion, vinegar, mustard, honey, and oil in a bowl. Season with salt and pepper. Let stand, tossing occasionally until onion is wilted, 5 to 10 minutes. Add collard greens and cabbage, and toss to coat. Chill 15 minutes. Toss in bacon.

## Deviled Egg Potato Salad

3 1/2 lb. Yukon gold potatoes, peeled and cut into 1-inch pieces  
Kosher salt  
Freshly ground black pepper  
1 c. mayonnaise  
3 tbsp. yellow mustard  
6 hard-boiled large eggs, peeled and chopped

3 celery ribs, thinly sliced, plus 1/4 cup chopped celery leaves  
6 scallions, thinly sliced  
1/3 c. chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley  
1 (4 ounce) jar diced pimentos, drained  
Sweet paprika, for garnish  
Place potatoes in a medium saucepan; cover with cold salted water. Simmer until tender, 4 to 5 minutes. Drain. Combine mayonnaise and mustard in a bowl. Add potatoes, eggs, celery and leaves, scallions, parsley, and pimentos, and toss to combine. Season with salt and pepper. Garnish with paprika.
