Bayshore Gardens Park & Recreation District Board of Trustees Meeting September 16, 2020 - 7:00 PM

1 & 2. The Meeting was called to Order at 7:05 PM by Chair John Lindsey.

Trustees Attending: Barbara Susdorf, Terry Zimmerly, Dan Rawlinson, John Lindsey, Morris Raymer, Melanie Woodruff, Barbara Greenberg, Steve Watkins and Lorna Pierce. A quorum was established.

- **3.** Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.
- **4.** Minutes from August 18th Board Meeting Motion to approve by Terry, seconded by Barbara Greenberg **Passed unanimously**
- **5. Treasurer's report** A copy of the balance sheet and the profit and loss statement was reviewed. This is the last month of the year. There is still some monies in the hall account, but probably not enough. Income at this time is far less than expected. Terry said it is very unlikely we will receive any more revenues this last month. Revenues likely lower due to non-payment of taxes by some residents, likely due to the on-going COVID-19 pandemic. She reported that we have \$489,000 in the budget and that was low. Starting in October, we can look at the whole year and it will provide a better idea of how much money will be available.
- **6. District Office Manager's Report** Gia reported Randy will be rebuilding the office steps. There is an issue with the center gate reader to the marina. Gia has contacted Tempus to see if it is still under warranty. Reader might have to be replaced. Cedar Hammock Fire Department has been here for the last few weeks training in our pool and beach area. While they were training, they decided to come into the marina area and found that there is an issue with our keypad allowing for emergency access. Gia has also contacted Tempus about fixing that issue.

7 - 9. Committee Reports

• **Playground** - Barbara Susdorf reported Gia had the playground inspected and we do not have enough

Additional mulch needs to be added in the areas that are too thin. The last supplier of the mulch provided quote of \$2,520 for the mulch. A question was raised about whether it was state mandated mulch is used or other materials. Barbara stated mulch is fine. Terry said they checked on the price for the alternate type of padding materials and it would be about \$20,000. Barbara Susdorf made a motion to allocate \$2,500 for the purchase of the mulch, Terry seconded the motion. - Passed unanimously · Hall Furnishings - Chairs, Morris brought a couple of different chairs for everyone present to see as an example to replace the current chairs. Quotes for all three chairs were given out for review. The white resin Hercules event chair - cost of \$24.00 each; the black vinyl Hercules banquet chair - cost of \$18.49 each; and, the grey fabric Hercules banquet chair - cost of \$25.99 each. All chairs are stackable. There was a discussion about all chair options. It was decided that Morris and Gia would get more quotes about chair prices and rack prices and this matter was tabled to be discussed in committee.

- · Acoustics Panels Drawings for review of where the panels would go were laid out for viewing. Several examples of the panels were offered for review. There were two companies that offered estimates. One was ATI (\$8,300 installed) and the other from Gulf Coast Ceiling Systems (\$7,500 installed). There was much discussion from board members and citizens that getting the acoustics fixed is a priority. It would take about 6 to 8 weeks for the order to delivery. A motion was made by Morris that the board spend up to \$6,000 to buy the panels directly and have Bayshore maintenance hang them. The colors of the panels will be similar to the wall colors. Terry seconded the motion. - Passed unanimously.
- **Vertical Fabric Blinds** Gia did research on blinds from Home Depot and Blinds to Go. Costs from each were presented for review. Blinds to

Go were the cheapest and easiest to install. It was decided to go with a neutral color and have them open in the middle. A cost \$301.17 would be for each set of blinds with all the parts. Gia said we need 4 sets to cover the hall and the board room. Barbara Greenberg believes that no more motions be made about expenditures for the hall as she is still waiting for a full accounting of current expenditures be presented. Terry clarified we have \$40,900 in the hall right funds and we will have an additional \$20,000 next month. The blinds, chairs, bathrooms, and acoustics can be completed for less than \$60,000. Morris made a motion that up to \$1,500 be spent to buy 4 sets of blinds. Motion was seconded by Melanie. There was a call for a vote. 8 – Yes and 1 – No by - Barbara Greenberg - Motion Passed · Old Awnings - Discussion was held regarding disposal of the old awnings. Morris said he had found a buyer for the awnings but didn't know how to set a price. Several of the people brought up that since this was property of the Bayshore District, that everyone should have a shot at buying them and not just sell them to one person. It was decided that Gia would place a notification in the Banner about public sale of the old awnings at \$50 each for large ones and \$10 each for small ones, noting they would be available for purchase on October 1st. Mr. Raymer made a motion regarding the advertisement of the sale of the awnings, Lorna Pierce seconded the motion, call for a vote and the motion. - Passed unanimously

- **10. Hall Renovation** Terry met with the contractor and he is willing to finish the two bathrooms, one will be the women's and the porch area. The estimated cost to the District is \$45,000 to continue with the current contractor. If we try to engage another contractor, we would have to buy the current contractor out of his agreement at about 30% of its value. A motion was made by Terry to spend \$45,000 to allow the current contractor to extend the permit and finish the women's hall bathroom and porch bathroom, Morris seconded, a vote was called and the motion **Passed unanimously**
- **11. Marina Asphalt -** Terry reported the contractor has finished the job but due to the rain, when they

were half done when they realized they needed more asphalt. Gia told them to go ahead and finish it rather than stopping in the middle. The additional asphalt costs \$245. Terry Zimmerly made a motion to pay \$245 for the additional asphalt, motion was seconded by Morris Raymer, call for a vote the motion – **Passed unanimously**

- **12. Boat Slips** Terry stated that a non-resident has requested to pay 6 months on his lease and then pay the other half after that. The marina is full and we should not lose anything by letting them pay 6 months at a time. Melanie says this changes the rules for just a few people and it should be brought up to the committee. Morris asked if this could be a temporary fix due to the corona virus since a lot of people are having financial issues. Gia said only one person asking for this exception and only for this year. The person asking for the exception is a non-resident and that does not seem fair to the residents. Melanie said all slip rentals used to be for 6 months for everyone. Any change to slip agreements should be sent back to committee to discussion. It was agreed that this should be sent back to committee for any potential change to the policy/procedure.
- **13. Boat Ramp** Morris suggested we sell boat ramp fobs to non-residents, 30 at first, for a couple hundred dollars. This could be an increase in revenue of \$6,000. High traffic time would likely be only on the holiday weekends. Morris pointed out that the ramp is a high-quality ramp and that the stress factor is almost a non-factor. It was recommended that this idea be sent back to the committee for discussion.
- **14. Malfeasance of Trustee** Dan made a motion to have a special hearing regarding the potential charges of Malfeasance of Trustee Steve Watkins and to have that meeting in the next two weeks. The motion was seconded by Melanie. Discussion

CERT - (Community Emergency Response Team)

VOLUNTEERS ALWAYS WELCOME AND NEEDED

MISSION STATEMENT

The CERT Team is committed to providing leadership and service to the community we serve in the event of a disaster or other emergency. We will strive to provide training and support to our community; and emergency response to aid our families, neighborhoods, and public safety professionals.

We are historically through the worst part of the Hurricane season. Our neighboring states have not been as fortunate as we have so far. What we have seen on our TV screens could be here. This could be our community and our volunteers assisting their neighbors with a well-trained volunteer force. You can be a part of this group of your neighbors with a few hours of training and a meeting once a month. Manatee County provides the training free of charge and issues the certification. We are a part of the Manatee County CERT program that is administered by Emergency Management. The Covid-19 pandemic has halted the training for right now, but you can meet with the CERT members and learn how you can participate should we have an emergency.

Our Team has recently assisted in the licensing of two more HAM radio operators. We offer the Ham classes to anyone who wishes the training and licensing. You can help in a disaster even without the CERT certification as long as you work with a Certified CERT member. We are all thinking that our cell phone is all we need to get help; however, the facts do not support that belief. The cell towers go down, the 911 service is overloaded, and we are left without any way to get help. CERT has capability of communicating with Emergency Management to get the help we may need. The help includes, police, fire, power company and medical help. We are also able to request the assistance of the Red Cross ERV, the vehicle that brings meals to a community. All of the services are dispatched by Manatee County Emergency Management. We can get the message thru and get help. CERTs are formed by people who wish to be better prepared for the hazards that threaten their communities, and the programs require a partnership between community members and local government emergency management and response agencies. FEMA supports CERT programs by conducting or sponsoring train-the-trainer (TTT) sessions for members of the fire, medical, and emergency management community. The objectives of the TTT are to prepare attendees to promote this training in their community; conduct TTTs at their location; conduct training sessions for neighborhood, business and industry, and government groups; and organize teams with which first responders can interface following a major disaster. Public Hearing - US 41 (SR 45) from 63rd Avenue West to 53rd Avenue West Manatee County, Florida Financial Project Identification (FPID) No: 444049-1

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District One will hold a Public Hearing for proposed improvements to US 41 (SR 45) from 63rd Avenue West to 53rd Avenue West on November 17, 2020. The meeting will begin with an open house at 5:30 pm, followed by a formal public hearing at 6 pm.

This segment of US41 is a seven-lane undivided roadway with a design and posted speed of 45 miles per hour. Left turns from US 41 are currently accommodated by a continuous two-way turn lane. To enhance traffic flow and reduce crash rates, the project will convert the continuous turn lane into a raised 11-foot-wide median with directional openings. The proposed project design will add traffic separators, mill and resurface the roadway, replace signal loops and apply new pavement markings. This project will also facilitate future corridor enhancements, which include adding mid-block pedestrian crossings. A map showing the project and hearing location is provided below.

The public hearing is being held to present information and obtain public input. The Department is offering two ways for the community to participate in the hearing. Interested persons may join the Virtual Public Hearing (VPH) from a computer, tablet, or cell phone; or they may participate in person at Bayshore Gardens Community Clubhouse at 6919 26thSt. West, Bradenton, Florida 34207. All participants will be a part of the same live hearing. A VPH is a free live presentation over the internet. If you wish to participate in the VPH online, from a computer, tablet or mobile device, registration is required in advance by going to:

online. Please note that GoToWebinar does not currently support Internet Explorer so a different browser should be used for registering/attending. Manatee Matters with Commissioner Misty Servia

Gwendolyn Brown - A Local Hero

I suspect we can all agree that the foundation of a community is largely equal to the education of their youth. Gwendolyn Brown understood that. She was a home-grown girl, graduated from Palmetto's Lincoln Memorial High School in 1969 and went on to earn her doctorate degree. A very well-educated woman. She was known for her work with Head Start and believed that our kids needed their eyes opened to possibilities before kindergarten so that their minds would be prepared to learn.

I was proud this weekend to join my Manatee County Housing Commissioners to honor Gwen with the dedication of a new community building at Pine Village, a local public housing development. The "Gwendolyn Brown Resident Center" will be a central hub where Pine Village residents and other neighbors can meet for classes, meetings, tutoring, and activities that will promote growth amongst a population where few opportunities exist. And if it couldn't be more perfect, this new center is located in District 4, the area I represent on the Manatee County Commission. I am doubly proud of this new facility.

I knew Gwen was pretty special from the day I met her in 1988, at my first planning job out of college with Manatee County. She was running against Ed Chance that year, a guy who solidly held his commission seat and was loved as a good-ole-boy, with whom you did not want to cross. Taking on that race was my first clue that she was one tough lady. She lost that election, but learned along the way that minorities running a county-wide race had little chance of winning and set out to change it. She pushed, along with the NAACP, the League of Women Voters and others to create 5 districts and 2 at-large seats on the county commission which is our current structure. Gwen eventually won a seat in 1994 as the first African-American Manatee County Commissioner. She later became Chairman



of the Commission, another first for African-Americans in Manatee.

Gwen was a policy maker who was cognizant of the needs of our most vulnerable citizens, like those living in public housing, those without jobs, or not enough food. Her fingerprint is throughout her district. Her lobbying efforts resulted in the money needed to build the Bradenton Village development through a Hope VI grant, replacing the blighted Rogers Gardens apartments. She was also key in securing \$250,000 to build the 13th Avenue Community Center, a building that is a vibrant space for low income youth today, and helped to create Lincoln Park where we will soon have a community pool. Those who

knew Gwen can imagine her signature huge smile if she were still here to see that future pool unveiled. Gwen is also credited with expanding 17th Street East in Palmetto and secured millions for other infrastructure improvements. Gwen served with a calm and kind demeanor and never got caught up in unnecessary drama - another quality I greatly admired.

Being the first African American commissioner, and a woman, I know that Gwen inspired a generation of young girls in Manatee County by showing them a path to success. I saw it first hand about 20 years ago when I witnessed a young girl

in the board chambers whisper excitedly and point to her hero seated at the dais. I'm sure there were many others like that young lady. Gwen was bold, brave, kind, and always straight-up. Having a building named in her honor, located in one of the most vulnerable neighborhoods in the county, will inspire young people for generations to come. They will hopefully learn to see past their limitations, just as Gwendolyn Brown did, and create a bridge to the future.




