MINUTES OF MEETING

March 21, 2018

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Bayshore Gardens Park and Recreation District was called to order by Chairman Maynard Boyce 7:22 pm and was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Notice of the meeting was posted in the February Bayshore Banner.

Roll Call: Steve Watkins, Sharon Denson, Terry Zimmerly, Dan Rawlinson, Maynard Boyce, Debbie Korell, Barbara Susdorf, Thom Williams, Jim Couey.

A quorum was established.

Present: Don Gassie, Suzanna Young, Laurie Boyce, Alan Riga, Barbara Greensburg, Holly Clouse.

Steve made a motion to approve the December 20, 2017 minutes. Terry seconded. **MOTION PASSED.**

Steve made a motion to approve the minutes for February 20, 2018 minutes. Jim Couey seconded. **MOTION PASSED.**

Steve made a motion to approve the minutes for the special meeting on March 5, 2018. Discussion; Debbie complained about the correct spelling of her name as it was spelled incorrectly in the minutes. Steve then rescinded his motion and made another motion to approve the amended minutes. Thom Williams seconded, **MOTION PASSED.**

BUDGET & FINANCE: Terry Zimmerly

Maynard addressed his concern regarding the presentation of the current budget. Sharon stated under the Uniform Accountability Act that the budget for Special Districts must be presented in the manner pursuant to F.S. 189. Debbie made a motion to approve the financials for February. Terry seconded, **MOTION PASSED**.

HOMEOWNERS ASSOC: Dan Rawlinson

Dan stated for the February meeting there was a potluck dinner and special guest from Edward Jones Financial who gave an informative talk on Scamming the Elderly which included useful handouts to all attendees. The community breakfast was very successful however Dan is looking for a sponsor for the next breakfast sometime in September to be posted in the August Banner. There will be a taco supper for the April meeting. Deputy Ralston from the sheriff's Crime Prevention Office will discuss trending law enforcement issues for our community and surrounding areas. Dan stated that the HOA meetings are always on the second Thursday beginning at 7 pm and breakfasts are always on the second Saturday of the month from 9 to 11 am.

Next meeting will be April 12th, 2018 at 7 pm.

CRIME WATCH: Steve Watkins

Steve reported that some of the security lights still require replacement in the marina and in front of the Woodchoppers building. He stated that he found a resident who has a lift machine who would replace the lights for us at a reduced cost on an as-needed basis. Contact information will be given to the District office. Steve stated that he has reserved 101 spaces/tables for the March 2018 Attic Sale. **Next meeting will be April 10th. 2018 at 7 pm.**

RESTORE BAYSHORE: Suzanna Young

Suzanna stated sidewalks will be installed on Columbia, Dartmouth and Roslyn. Bids are currently out for Florida Blvd. During her meeting crosswalks with painted lines and lighted crosswalks were discussed. Paving that was recently completed on Harvard covered up part of the gutter area. Apparently there is a drainage issue. Suzanna stated that contacts for the Manatee County Public Works paving and drainage issues will be posted

in the April edition of the Banner. **Next meeting will be** cies. Then Steve nominated Dan to be First Vice **April 9th, at 6:30 pm.** Chairman, Sharon seconded. Then it was suggested to

MANAGER'S REPORT: Jodie Lawman

Jodie stated that Quick Books is being programmed to generate auto billing to all boat slip owners in the marina every 6 months. This system of auto billing will also work for the Banner ads to track payments. An accounting sheet will be attached to the Banner contracts. The chart of accounts in Quick Books is in the process of being narrowed to eliminate duplication of accounts. This process is very time consuming. This discussion will be tabled for the next work session meeting. Variety Fence company repaired the hurricane damaged fence at the pool and marina. Jodie would not recommend them for future work due to their inability to appear on time and lack of professional conduct. Randy from maintenance built a shelving unit for the record room. This will assist us in establishing an organized and methodical system for inventory of the records we are to retain per state statute. The locks to this room will be changed and access to this room will be accomplished by a sign in/sign out sheet in the office. Maynard mentioned that all of the documents in the record/electrical room should be scanned to the cloud and the paper destroyed. Jodie acknowledged this and stated that retention periods need to be researched first so that we may shred the documents that are not necessary. Maynard voiced concerned that Laine Boyce was not getting an aquatics book and forms done during her office time. Jodie inquired about the aquatic's position and asked why this position did not have a job description in the District's employee handbook. She further stated that it was her understanding that Laine was hired for office duties. Laine was dismissed from office duties on 3/16/18 due to her inability to perform the required aspects of the position and lack of experience in an office environment. Jodie then mentioned that the hiring of a relative, of a Board member, for compensation by the District is cited in FL. Statute 112.3135(d) and (2)a. This issue has gone to Attorney James Dye for a legal opinion. Much discussion among the Trustees and attending residents ensued regarding this issue and the conflict of interest. Thereafter, Chairman Maynard Boyce read his letter of resignation from the Board of Trustees. He further stated that he previously had not intended to run for another term as chairman. He further stated that he has been on the board of Trustees for 21 years and that it was time to resign. He asked that the current Board members reinstate the youth activities that were removed by previous board members. Members then voiced their appreciation to Maynard for his work and dedication to the District.

As First Vice Chairman, Debbie took control of the remainder of the meeting. Jim Couey then made a motion to pause the meeting for 5 minutes. Steve seconded as one of the Trustees left the room. Meeting then resumed with Debbie nominating Thom Williams to be the next Chairman of the Board, Sharon seconded the motion. Thom requested he be given a short period of time to consider his nomination. After further discussion, the motion and seconded was rescinded. There was a suggestion to place an ad in the April banner to fill the vacancy on the Board. Steve said he would see that this was accomplished. Then Debbie directed the suggestion to Jim Couey. Jim said that he would resign his position as Banner Chair. Debbie then stated that she did not recognize Jim's resignation. Then Steve made a motion to appoint Debbie as Chairman, Jim seconded, MOTION PASSED. Then there was further discussion on procedural actions to fill the Board vacancies. Then Steve nominated Dan to be First Vice Chairman, Sharon seconded. Then it was suggested to continue the meeting and leave the other vacancies to be decided at a later meeting. The motion and second was then rescinded.

Jodie said she has received estimates from Dehart and Big Fish contractors to make the necessary repairs to the cameras at the marina. Steve made a motion to accept the estimate from Big Fish, Terry seconded MOTION PASSED. Dehart will no longer make any repairs to the camera system due to the many delays for requested services. A new part-time office assistant was hired to fill the current vacancy. Steve made a motion to approve the new hire and stated that she was one of the interviewees that he reviewed for the previous District manager position. The motion was seconded by Dan, MOTION PASSED. There will be extended office hours for people renewing their boat slip contracts for Tuesday April 3rd and Thursday April 5th until 6 pm.

POLICIES/PROCEDURES: Sharon Denson

Sharon said that there are 4 policies up for review. These will be posted on the web site and will require a Board vote to approve.

WEB/BANNER: Steve Watkins for Jim Couey

Work is continuing to identify and remove from the Banner those ads that are no longer being paid for and to create contracts for advertisers who want to continue advertising with us. This has become an issue due to so many of the contracts missing from the office. The extra issues of the Banner that were ordered are fulfilling the distribution requirements of the new advertisers. Many thanks to Lenny Lyons for his creation of the Sales Blitz which added several 1 year contracts to Banner advertising. **Next meeting will be April 17th**

MARINA: Debbie Korell

Debbie stated that work is continuing to address all of the delinquencies with the marina contracts. **Next meeting will be April 17th 2018 at 7 pm.**

HOUSE & GROUNDS: Steve Watkins

The mangroves located at the beach area are again becoming an issue and require trimming. At a previous Board meeting it was discussed that the plants would be trimmed on a yearly basis. The wood gates that close in front of the dumpsters have become a hazard and may fall off during any further use. Due to the heavy weight of the doors and the rusted steel cable dragging on the ground that has already caused a trip hazard, suggest that they be removed immediately. Ballots will be collected for the design challenge vote in April.

OLD BUSINESS: No old business.

Garden Club Restore Bayshore Reports

Please join us for the April meeting on Monday, April 2nd at 1 pm. The program is a tour of Detweilers Farm Market arranged by Marie Young. We will meet in the parking lot of the Bayshore Gardens Community Center at 1 pm in order to carpool to Detweilers Farm Market located at the corner of University and Lockwood Ridge Road.

The program for March, coordinated by Ann Wells, was Mosquito Control presented by Katie Williams from the Manatee County Mosquito Control District. Katie is a biologist with the district whose primary responsibility is research but works closely with the entomologists responsible for control and surveillance.

We learned that it's the female that bites for blood to feed the eggs. The four stages of the mosquito life cycle are: Egg - Larva - Pupa - Adult.

Type of mosquito depends on season and temperature with water and warm being the ideal. It is possible for mosquitoes to lay 1.3 million eggs / acre.

The district uses larvicide for control and uses helicopters to treat 10,000 - 30,000 acres / year. Adult mosquitoes usually fly 2-3 hours after sunset.

The website is www.manateemosquito.com and the phone number is 941-981-3895 for information about what can be done to keep mosquitoes from breeding in your backyard. Marie Young was our hostess at the meeting.

Sidewalk construction: Concerns arose about sidewalk work ruining landscape items in the right-of-way. Was there any compensation for relandscaping? It was decided that individuals need to contact Tony Russo, Public Works, to check out if there can be compensations since the County "owns" the right of way. (Permits have clauses about relocating items for free for County Improvements.)

Resurfacing and drainage: There was discussion on the recent resurfacing operation east of the canal and that the paving covered what was left of gutters from last (over) paving years ago. We are left with worsened drainage and little to no room for painted house numbers on the curb. There are very few inlets in the area and drainage problems cause water to back-up onto private property at Dartmouth and Marilyn Ave. Contact: Brian Martineau, Pavement Manager for county resurfacing.

County contacts: Manatee County Public Works 941-708-7497; Water / Sewer 941-792-8811 x4999. There is a Town Hall planned for March 22nd at 6:30, Church at 833 Magellan Dr. Addressing drainage.

Discussed/proposing crosswalk signage and markings at Florida Blvd and 26th St W. Also a crosswalk on 26th Street W between Florida Blvd and BG Pkwy. (Follow up with our Commissioner after January Town Hall is definitely needed) Public Works and Traffic Management can also be contacted. See phone list in this issue.

A table has been reserved at the Attic Sale March 24 for Restore BG. The table is in the middle of the Hall. Anyone can bring items to sell themselves or items to donate to Restore BG to sell.

The Florida Blvd Force Main Project (and sidewalk) contract is 'out' for bids.

Sidewalk construction bids are 'in' for the Dartmouth, Columbia and Roslyn.

In answer to one of our Town Hall questions: Prototype speed tables are not supported by the County for south end of 26th St W-- They said 'no'.

All we can hope for until we ever get the Speed Table Surveys in are that our pedestrians, joggers, bicyclist and kids in general remain, nimble and alert!

Next RESTORE meeting will be April 9, at 6:30 pm.

Our next meeting is Saturday, May 12 at 10 am in the shop.

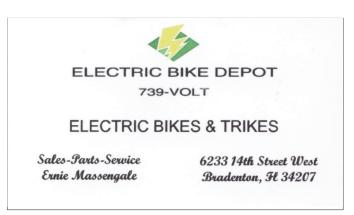
As always use safety equipment when using any power tool. Members have use of the Shop 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. 2018 Memberships

Marina Improvements & Repairs

Weekly marina inspections are performed to identify repairs that are needed to maintain safe marina operation. Please report to the dockmaster any issues that may have been overlooked that require marina personnel's attention.

The Bayshore Gardens boat ramp construction project was in the works prior to tropical storm Emily late last year. After Emily, the demand for marina/seawall related construction work surged causing the original project bid to more than dou-

BOAT SLIP RENEWAL TIME

Effective March 31st, many boat slip leases will expire. You may renew anytime prior to the 31st with the deadline being April 15th. Thereafter, late fees will incur. When coming to the office to renew, you must bring the following documents:

Bayshore residents must provide proof of residency, (drivers license, government issued I.D.) to qualify for resident rates, current registration and insurance cards for the boat. The policy must contain a minimum liability coverage of \$100,000.

The Bayshore Marina currently has a bi-annual renewal period for boat slip leases. The first one runs from October 1 through March 31st. The second period is from April 1st through September 30th. Upon contract renewal, a new lease is signed and the monthly slip fee is paid for the six (6) month period. New boat slip leases will pay the six (6) month fee along with a \$500 security deposit which is refundable when you vacate the slip and no damage is noted.

The office, Marina Chair and Dockmaster are working on a more streamlined process for our boat slip holders. Please be aware that current policy allows the slip holder to update registration and/or insurance documents upon their expiration by emailing to: bayshoregardens@hotmail.com; fax #941-739-3515; U.S. postal service; 6919 26th St. W., Bradenton, FL 34207 or our after-hours drop box to the left of the breezeway entrance near the pool. As a slip lessee, it is your responsibility to keep current registration and insurance documents of record with the office in accordance with your Lease Agreement.

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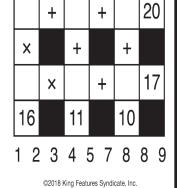

Florida Seasonal Recipes

Tropical Mango Soup

1 large mango, peeled and seeded

1/2 small onion, diced

1/2 cup cold water

1-2 small chili peppers, minced

1 lime, juiced

1/2 tsp fresh ginger root, peeled and minced

2 tablespoons plain Greek yogurt

1/2 teaspoon honey

kosher salt to taste

In a blender or food processor, add mango, onion, water, chili pepper, lime juice and ginger. Blend ingredients until smooth. Taste and adjust seasoning with salt. In a small mixing bowl, combine yogurt and honey; stir to combine. Serve soup chilled and garnished with yogurt mixture.

Vegetable and Chicken Pasta

12 oz whole-wheat penne pasta

2 large tomatoes, diced small

2 zucchinis, diced small

2 cups chicken, cooked and chopped

½ cup vegetable broth

olive oil for cooking

5 garlic cloves, chopped fine

6 ounces fresh spinach

½ cup fresh parsley, chopped

2 tablespoons unsalted butter

1 lemon, juiced

freshly grated Parmesan cheese for garnish Bring a medium-sized stockpot of salted water to a boil, and cook pasta to desired tenderness. Drain and run room-temp water over to cool off. Preheat a large sauté pan over medium-high heat. Add 1 tbsp olive oil to preheated pan. Add zucchini and garlic and cook for 2 minutes. Add tomato, lemon juice, cooked chicken and broth. Bring to a boil; add spinach and cooked pasta. Stir and continue to cook for another 2 to 3 minutes. Stir in butter. Taste and adjust seasoning with salt and pepper. Stir in the chopped parsley. Serve hot, garnished with lots of Parmesan cheese.

Potato and Green Bean Salad

2 lbs potatoes, washed, peeled and diced 1/2 lb fresh green beans, washed, ends trimmed and cut into thirds

3 bell peppers, seeded and diced small

1 cup fresh parsley, chopped fine

1 red onion, diced small

1/2 cup low-fat mayonnaise

2 lemons, juiced; 1/4 cup olive oil Fill a large-sized stockpot 3/4 of the way full and lightly salt the water. Bring to a rolling boil over med-high heat. Fill a medium-sized mixing bowl halfway with ice and water. Add the trimmed and cut green beans to boiling water and let cook for 2 to 3 minutes. Using a hand strainer, remove green beans and place them into ice water. After they are cooled, remove and set aside. Carefully add potatoes to same boiling water greens beans were cooked in. Cook potatoes for around 15 minutes until slightly firm, yet tender. Using a colander placed in the sink, drain the potatoes and run cold water over them so they cool off and stop cooking. In a large mixing bowl, combine mayo, lemon juice and olive oil. Stir the mixture to combine. Add rest of ingredients to bowl and lightly stir to combine. Taste and adjust seasoning with salt and pepper. Keep cold in fridge and stir before serving.

Blueberry Parfait

2 pints fresh Florida blueberries, rinsed 2 cups granola

3 cups low-fat vanilla yogurt

1/2 cup blueberry jam; 1/4 cup water fresh mint sprigs for garnish

In a small mixing bowl, combine blueberry jam and water. Use a whisk to completely mix the jam and water together. In four parfait glasses, make layers using granola, yogurt and fresh blueberries. Evenly add one layer of the blueberry jam mixture. Top each parfait with fresh blueberries and garnish with mint. Serve cold.

Stuffed Yellow Squash Parmesan

2 medium zucchini or large yellow squash

1/2 cup ricotta cheese

1 ½ cups mozzarella cheese, shredded

1 cup marinara sauce (your favorite)

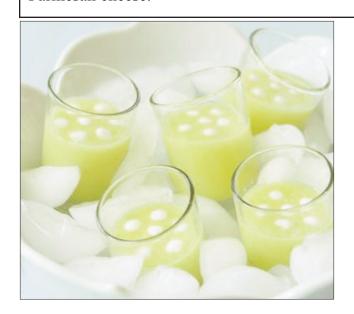
1/4 cup Parmesan cheese, grated

1/2 cup panko breadcrumbs

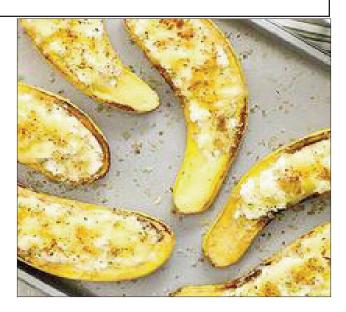
olive oil for cooking 2 tablespoons fresh basil or 1 teaspoon dried sea salt and fresh ground pepper to taste Cut off stem side of squash. Cut squash evenly in half lengthwise. Scoop out seeds from each half. Preheat large sauté pan over med-high heat. Add 1 tsp of olive oil to preheated pan. Season squash with salt and pepper, anmd place skin side up in sauté pan. Cook for about 2 minutes on both sides. Remove and place on cookie sheet skin side down. Preheat oven to 375. In small bowl, combine breadcrumbs, 1 tbsp olive oil, basil and Parmesan cheese. Season twith salt and pepper and stir. Evenly distribute ricotta cheese and marinara sauce on top of squash. Top with shredded mozzarella. Evenly sprinkle breadcrumb topping mixture on top. Bake for 10 minutes or until golden brown and cheese is bubbly. Remove from oven. Serve warm.

Open Face Watermelon Sandwiches

1/4 med watermelon, remove seeds & rind 1 handful fresh mint leaves, chopped 8 ounces goat cheese; olive oil 1/2 loaf crusty bread, sliced thin Crumble chilled goat cheese into a small bowl. Lightly mix cheese and chopped mint. Add salt and pepper. Cut bread into 8 small slices and drizzle with olive oil. Toast bread slices until golden brown and crispy on top. Let cool slightly. Spread cheese mixture on top of each slice of bread. Cut watermelon slices into fun shapes and layer on top of cheese. Lightly season top of sandwiches Serve at room temperature.













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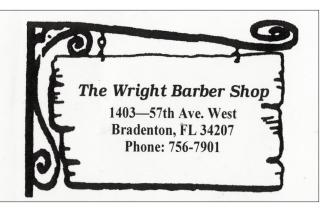
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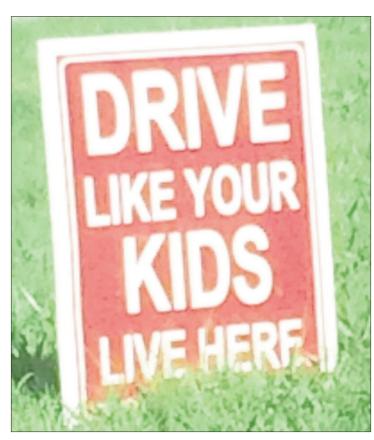
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
