A quorum was established.

Present: Joanne Manse, Suzanna Young, John Woodruff, Holly Clouse, Laura Harris, Marie Young, Terry Zimmerly, Vickie Ford.

Bob made a motion to approve the October minutes. Steve seconded. **Motion Passed.**

Bob made a motion to approve the October financials. Steve seconded. **Motion Passed.**

Following a discussion of Trustee Sparrow's absence of the last three consecutive meetings without Board approval, motion made by Bob King, seconded by Steve Watkins and passed unanimously removing Jeannette Sparrow from the Board of Trustees. A letter will be written informing her.

Bob reported on the ADA compliance report he received. The most important is to have an ADA accessible bathroom in the hall. The simplest way to do this is to

take part of the Banner office and make a unisex bathroom. With 125 slips in our marina we need to have four accessible docks. Discussion was made on renting just the boardroom. If this happens, the price would be the same as for renting the hall. There has been much discussion on the cameras. Bob made a motion not to exceed \$13,000.00 to upgrade our camera system and replace the ones that aren't working. Debbie seconded. **Motion passed.** Steve asked if the wildlife cameras had been purchased to monitor the entrance to the marina. Bob stated they had not and asked Steve if he would research 3 different cameras that could be used and notify the office. Steve agreed. *Next meeting is December 9th at 5:30 pm.*

PERSONNEL & SALARY: Bob King

Bob reported there were two meetings. Bob forwarded his minutes. Bob stated our by-laws require we have two signatures on the checks. Bob and Don's term is up at the end of December and Don will be out of town until mid December. Don resigned his position as 2nd Vice Chair. Bob will be out of town in December and resigned his position as 1st Vice Chair. This was done so the Chairman could appoint a new 1st and 2nd vice for check signing until the end of the year. Maynard appointed Richard Nelson as 1st Vice Chair and Debbie Korell as 2nd Vice Chair. Bob presented a status report for use by the staff and will be reviewed at the next board meeting. Garden Club

The December meeting will be Monday, December 14 at 12:30 pm for the Christmas Luncheon at Mamma Onesti's, 6152 14th St. West. Mamma Onesti's faces Bayshore Gardens Pkwy in the Bayshore Gardens Shopping Center.

The November meeting was a presentation by Gary Adams from The Plant Place, 6611 14th St. West, Bradenton. Gary is an entertaining and informative speaker. His topics were 1) how to have a healthy yard and plants using a natural approach, 2) organic fertilizing with chicken manure "Green Chick - Poultry Compost", and 3) the many benefits of the Moringa tree, powder, and oil.

Good soil is organic matter decomposed by microbes pulling nitrogen out of the air. Under the right conditions microbes will double every 20 minutes. Worms indicate organic material and will inoculate the soil with microbes. Microbes survive on the glucose from plants. With good microbial activity it is possible for 1 acre to generate 1.5 tons of topsoil/year. Gary gave a recipe for building up microbial activity in a Florida yard

by spreading a thin layer of potting soil and then inoculating with a "brew" using worm castings. Put worm castings in a nylon stocking or old sock and place in a garbage can of non-chlorinated water. Add 2 tablespoons of generic molasses and brew for 24 hours. Spray on everything, yard, plants, and vegetables. Do not apply in the heat of the day, preferably late afternoon. Water in, keeping in mind that all activity is in the top 4 inches.

Gary explained the benefits of fertilizing with quality chicken manure from chickens with a high quality diet that contains calcium. This is because plants require calcium to pick up nitrogen. And that natural nitrogen is much better than chemical nitrogen. He recommended the book "Teaming with Microbes" for additional information.

All of the benefits of the Moringa tree, powder, and oil are too numerous to document in this article. Gary provided handouts about Moringa and brought a small plant as well as a bottle of oil. He encouraged those present to try the oil on their hand or face. Also, several people present shared their success stories with their use of Moringa in their diets and in some cases growing Moringa and drying the leaves for their consumption. Moringa plants, powder and oil are available at The Plant Place.

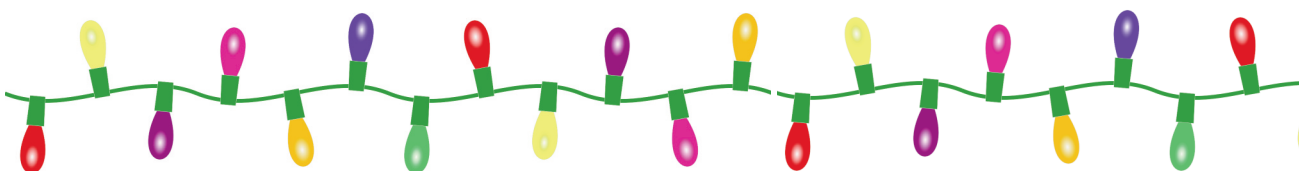

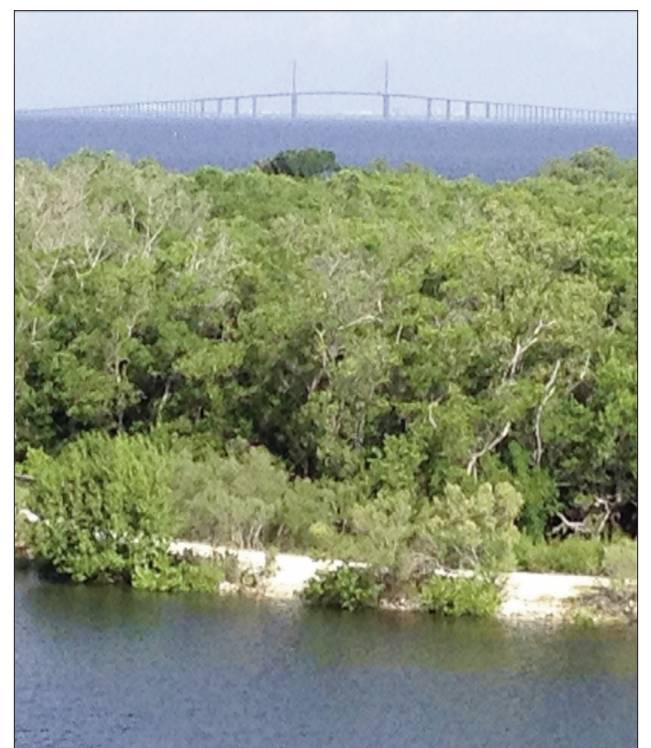

SIMPLE AND EFFECTIVE LANDSCAPING TIPS

Landscaping adds “curb appeal” to your home and leaves a great first impression. There are several inexpensive landscaping tips that will add visual appeal to your yard and enhance the overall appearance.

A yard with a beautiful landscape is one of the few home investments with a value that increases over the years. Buyers love mature plants and trees, so giving your yard some love even if your not planning on selling for a few years is a smart way to go. The outside of your home should reflect your personal style as much as the interior of your home.

Getting your ideas down on paper will let you weed out all the unnecessary components and keep the elements that are really important to you. Be objective when setting the budget for your project. But try as you may to list every item you will need, you should add 15% to 20% to your budget to cover unexpected expenses. Start by trimming trees and shrubs or vines that overwhelm windows and porches. This simple task will open these area up. Pull the weeds. This is the equivalent of de-cluttering the outdoors and is an inexpensive fix.

Preparation is the key to maintaining a healthy landscaping that will thrive. Amend the soil in the landscape beds with compost to improve the drainage of tight soils to prevent diseases. Take care of problem weeds before you go through the work of planting. An effective organic weed killer is to use full strength vinegar with some dish soap. Mixing ratio recommended is adding one tablespoon of dish soap per gallon of vinegar and then applying with a hand held sprayer. This solution can also be used after planting, as it does not harm plants and bushes. Spectracide Weed and Grass Killer can also be used.

Master gardeners often hold sessions at your local library or home improvement garden centers and offer great advice for options in planting that will thrive without expensive maintenance. The Internet can also give you guidance for the area in which you live by suggesting plant varieties for your climate. After gathering information, start by drawing a landscape plan. Recommended tips from landscape professionals can guide you with options. Plant in odd multiples. Aim for 1’s, 3’s, 5’s, etc. and keep in mind the spread in planting. Upon maturity, some plants may have a 12-inch to 30-inch growth.

Read the directions that accompany the plant to assist you in placement. Make a statement by planting varieties in mass, keeping in mind the recommended spread. When purchasing plants, read the sun exposure the item can tolerate. Choose carefully based on the area in which you will plant these items and the exposure time that area will be subject to sunlight. A final touch to make the plants eye-catching is mulch. Its comes in a variety of shades and will make your plant and flower beds stand out visually. Aside from the visual appeal, mulch helps conserve moisture and stave off bugs.

Other simple and inexpensive items include power washing and curbing. Pressure washing fences and patios is simple and can brighten these areas, taking years off by removing build up and making them look new. A stone walkway leading to the front door or a garden area looks inviting and well manicured. Add solar lighting to make it stand out or line it with mulch and plants. Be creative when curbing flowerbeds by adding railroad ties, rocks or concrete curbing. This will

add appeal and conformity to these areas. The local Habitat for Humanity Stores in our area sells these items at discounted rates.

Once all the labor is done and you are admiring your hard work, don’t forget the maintenance to keep the appealing look of these areas. Perennials will occasionally need to be divided and replanted to keep them healthy. Apply spot applications of weed and grass killer to keep them from taking over your flowerbeds. Add compost to the base of the plants to keep them healthy and refresh dull mulch to keep the color bright.

Landscaping can make such a difference to the exterior of the home it is time and money well spent. Choose a style and maintenance plan that works for you. A weekend of hard work will pay off for years to come and hopefully will inspire your neighbors to do the same.

Don't Cut That Line!

You can save a bird at the end of the fishing line. Do NOT cut him free and allow the bird to fly back to the mangroves, he will get trapped, be unable to free himself, and starve to death!

Pelicans are magnificent waterbirds and interesting to watch. They've been around long before we came to Florida. They are nature's children, too.

Our Pelican population has been dwindling due to loss of habitat, our changing weather patterns, human disturbance and predators, which include invasive crows, and incidents and accidents with us humans. This is a lot to handle for a non-aggressive wild waterbird.

Never feed the seabirds, especially pelicans. Feeding them catfish, and leftovers from cleaned fish, is dangerous as exposed bones can cause internal injuries all the way to the stomach. While they know not to eat catfish, they will catch a thrown catfish and swallow it. The fish then flares its spines and can't be dislodged. Bones can even puncture the stomach. When a pelican catches a fish, it goes down intact and gets digested from the outside in. Also by feeding, the pelicans "learn" to follow humans for snacks and will annoy them by hanging around, possibly snatching a fish on the line, thus ingesting the hook.

Enter the dilemma and harm: an Ingested hook

not tended to, can cause nerve, tissue and tendon damage; severe infections, starvation. All horrible deaths.

If a bird has swallowed the hook, do not attempt to extract the hook yourself. Take it to the nearest veterinarian; in Bayshore Gardens: Bayshore Animal Hospital is the nearest rescue/clinic.

Hook extraction tips: Push hook through flesh until barb is visible. Next, with barb now showing, use your cutting pliers, (a common fishing tool) and cut behind the barb. Next, back hook out. Do not pull the hook out If the barb is still attached, serious tissue damage will occur.

Rescue tips: Snare the bird from head down. Tuck the wings next to its body by wrapping your arms around it. Covering its head and eyes will keep it calmer. Do Not hold bill closed, it cuts off their breathing. Place hand high on bill and use fingers to keep bill open; pointing beak away.

We humans, at the top of the food chain, have a



responsibility to be the purveyors of our natural world when we infringe on that world.

Salted Fudge Brownies

1 1/2 sticks unsalted butter
2 oz unsweetened chocolate, finely chopped
1/4 cup plus 2 tbsp unsweetened cocoa
2 cups sugar
3 large eggs
1 1/2 tsp pure vanilla extract
1 cup all-purpose flour
1/2 tsp Maldon sea salt

Preheat the oven to 350°. Line a 9" square metal cake pan with foil, draping foil over edges. Lightly butter foil. In a large saucepan, melt butter with unsweetened chocolate over very low heat, stirring occasionally. Remove from heat. Whisking them in one at a time until thoroughly incorporated, add cocoa, sugar, eggs, vanilla and flour. Pour batter into prepared pan and smooth the surface. Sprinkle salt evenly over batter. Using a butter knife, swirl the salt into the batter. Bake the fudge brownies in the center of oven for about 35 minutes, until edge is set but center is still a bit soft and a toothpick inserted into the center comes out coated with a little of the batter. Let the brownies cool at room temperature in the pan for 1 hour, then refrigerate just until they are firm, about 1 hour. Remove from foil and serve.

Poached Pears with Prunes

2 quarts water; 1 cup sugar
1/2 navel orange, w/skin, sliced 1/2" thick
One 3-inch cinnamon stick
1 bay leaf; 1 whole clove
6 large Bartlett pears, with stems, peeled
12 pitted prunes; Butter cookies, for serving
In a large pot, bring water to a boil with sugar, orange slices, cinnamon stick, bay leaf and clove; stir to dissolve sugar. Add pears and prunes and cook over moderate heat, turning the pears often, until pears are tender, about 25 minutes. Using a slotted spoon, transfer pears and prunes to a shallow serving bowl. Boil the poaching liquid over high heat until reduced to 1 1/2 cups, about 10 minutes. Strain the syrup over pears. Serve warm or at room temperature, with the butter cookies alongside.

Gingerbread Cheesecake Dip

8 oz cream cheese, softened
1/4 cup brown sugar
1/4 cup powdered sugar, sifted
3 tbsp molasses; 1 tsp ground ginger
1 tsp ground cinnamon; dash nutmeg
4 oz Cool Whip
Graham crackers for serving
Beat the cream cheese until smooth, about 1 minute. Add the sugars and molasses and beat on medium speed until smooth and combined, about 1 seconds. Add the ginger, cinnamon, and nutmeg and mix until combined. Add the Cool Whip and beat until combined, about 1 minute. Transfer dip to a serving bowl and chill until ready to serve. Serve with graham crackers. Dip can be stored in an airtight container for up to 1 week in the refrigerator.

Buttery Shortbread Cookies

2 cups butter, cold and cut into pieces
1 cup packed light brown sugar
4 1/2 cups all purpose flour, divided
Optional: Your favorite sprinkles
Preheat oven to 325F. Line baking sheets with parchment paper and set aside. In the bowl of a stand mixer, add butter and brown sugar. Using paddle attachment, mix until fluffy and light. Add 3 1/2 cups of the flour and mix until combined. On a large board, sprinkle 1/2 cup flour. Knead dough by hand for 5 minutes, adding as much of the remaining 1/2 cup flour as needed to make a soft dough. The dough should end up soft and pliable, similar to play-dough, not sticky. Work in desired amount of sprinkles, if using. Form a ball, wrap tightly, and chill for about 30 minutes. Roll dough out to about 1/2 inch thickness. Either cut into 3x1 rectangular strips, triangles, or use cookie cutter for shapes. Place each cookie 2 inches apart on baking sheet. Poke cookies with fork to design if not using sprinkles. Bake 15-20 minutes, or until edges are golden brown. If your shapes are smaller, bake less time. Bake longer for bigger shapes. Cool completely on wire rack.

Candied Popcorn Stars

1 cup sugar; 1/3 cup light corn syrup
1/3 cup water; 2 tbsp. butter
1/4 tsp. salt; 1 tsp. vanilla
8 cup Popped Corn
1/3 cup red and/or green nonparells
1/4 cup cinnamon candies
Combine sugar and next 3 ingredients in a heavy sauce pan. Cook over medium-low heat, stirring often, until butter melts and sugar dissolves. Increase heat to medium; bring to a boil. Cook, without stirring, until candy thermometer registers 255 degrees F. Remove from heat; stir in salt and vanilla. Quickly pour mixture over popcorn; toss gently to coat. Add nonparells, tossing gently to combine. Moisten or grease hands. Working quickly, press the mixture into 5-inch star-shaped cookie cutter. If candied corn becomes too hard to shape, place in a warm (200 degrees F) oven for a few minutes to soften.

Blueberry Monkey Bread Bake

1/2 cup granulated sugar
1 tsp ground cinnamon
2 cans (16.3 oz each) Pillsbury™ Grands!™ Homestyle refrigerated blueberry biscuits
1/2 cup blueberries
1/3 cup blueberry jam
1 cup powdered sugar
3 to 4 tbsp milk
Heat oven to 350°F. Grease 13x9-inch pan with shortening or cooking spray. In large resealable food-storage plastic bag, mix granulated sugar and cinnamon. Separate dough into 16 biscuits; cut each into quarters. Shake in bag to coat. Arrange in pan, covering bottom of pan completely. Top with blueberries. In small microwavable bowl, microwave jam uncovered on High 15 to 30 seconds or until melted. Drizzle over biscuits. Bake 30 to 35 minutes or until golden brown and no longer doughy in center. Cool 10 minutes. In medium bowl, mix powdered sugar and milk to drizzling consistency; drizzle on top. To serve, cut into squares or scoop out with a spoon.
