BAYSHORE GARDENS GARDEN CLUB

March 6, 2023

Judy Drake, President, called the meeting to order at 1:00. A pledge to the flag was made by the fifteen in attendance. We welcomed Yvette, a newcomer, to the meeting. We decided to enjoy the refreshments provided by Marie Young while listening to the speaker and postpone the business meeting.

Monarch Butterfly Presentation - Judy introduced Marlene Durgin, a resident monarch butterfly raiser. Marlene began raising Monarchs in her backyard in 2020. Her interest in Monarchs began when researching plant selections for her yard through the 'Native Plant Society'. The Society has many educational seminars and other activities to encourage residents to use Florida plants.

Butterflies have specific host plants. Milkweed plant is the sole plant for the young monarch larva/caterpillars to eat. Milkweed is the 'host' plant. They live on the plant until time for their transformation into an adult butterfly - egg, larvae (caterpillar), pupa (chrysalis), then adult butterfly. Florida's milkweed plant is different than milkweed in New York State. The eggs and caterpillars need to be protected from being eaten by spiders, ants, and wasps. Birds will not eat the caterpillars because they are bitter and a bit toxic. The milkweed plant should be purchased from a store that does not use pesticides, etc. Poisons will cause mutations. If you have problems with ants use a combination of sugar and baking soda to eliminate. Coffee grounds will repel ants, also.

Marlene said that the monarchs have declined 85% in general and in California 95%, due to loss of the host plants. Much of this is from GMO crops grown in herbicide cleared fields. The GMO plants are immune to the herbicide, but all others are killed, limiting nursery and nectar plants for butterflies.

Marlene brought 4 milkweed plants; one with an egg, one with a hanging caterpillar and

one plant where a caterpillar had just gone into the chrysalis stage. Gwen and Marlene witnessed the caterpillar go into the chrysalis stage just before the meeting. It was like it took off a little black dress. Also, there was one plant with aphid eggs kept separate that Marlene will spray with a Dawn and water solution and wipe clean of aphids. The milkweed sap is toxic to people. The plant should be kept in partial shade. Do not overpopulate the plant. One caterpillar can consume a plant in about two weeks. Other options for feeding the caterpillars are organically grown cut fruit like cantaloupe melon. Marlene brought three butterfly cages (to protect the caterpillars from predators). They could be borrowed by members. The males can fertilize a female immediately upon adulthood. The full cycle to adulthood takes about 30 days. The difference between the male and female adult is a dot on the lower wings of the males.

Besides the 'Native Plant Society', there is information on the University of Florida IFAS website. Organically grown milkweed plants can be purchased at The Plant Place and other certified plant nurseries. Butterfly identification pamphlets are available at museums and bookstores. Marlene offered three plants and an identification pamphlet for a small price.

Judy called the business meeting to order.

We thanked Marlene for an informative presentation. We thanked Marie Young for the treats.

The minutes from the February 10th Meeting were distributed prior the meeting and were available in the March Banner. Joyce made a motion to accept the minutes. Marie Young seconded the motion. With no objection the minutes were accepted. Marie Young gave the Treasurers Report. There are currently sixteen

Native Blooming Now: Bahama Senna (*Senna mexicana* var. *chapmanii*)*

The year-round yellow flower clusters of the Bahama senna make a cheery addition to any landscape. This is a fast growing, two- to four- foot perennial shrub suitable for Zones 10-11. Although short-lived, it is easy to grow, being unfussy about soil, fairly drought tolerant, and easily pruned. In full sun, the Bahama senna will be a dense sprawly shrub with a three- to five-foot spread.

The Bahama senna is a lovely native typically found at the edges of pine rocklands and rockland hammocks and because it has such a small range, is a state-listed threatened species. A pollinator magnet, it is both a larval and nectar plant for yellow butterflies: the cloudless sulphur, sleepy orange, and orange-barred sulphur butterflies. If you are looking for a similar looking shrub but want more height than sprawl, privet cassia (*Cassia ligustrina*, another Florida native) looks similar but will grow six to eight feet. As always, source from a native nursery; there are several non-natives that may look similar but are not suitable for planting here.
